NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. The principal accounting policies has been applied consistently during the period and are set out below.

In accordance with FRS 2 "Accounting for Subsidiary Undertakings" and Section 228 of the Companies Act 1985, group financial statements have not been prepared because the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of a body corporate, incorporated in England and Wales.

Cash flow statement

In accordance with paragraph 5 of FRS 1 "Cash Flow Statements (Revised)", the company, being the wholly owned subsidiary of another company which prepares a cash flow statement including the cash flows of this company, has not prepared such a statement itself.

Other income

This income consists of a fee for holding title to a head lease on behalf of the Tesco Fuchsia Limited Partnership.

Taxation

The amount included in the Profit and Loss account is based on the profit or loss on ordinary activities before taxation and is calculated at current local tax rates, taking into account timing differences and the likelihood of realisation of deferred tax assets and liabilities.

2. PROFIT ON ORDINARY ACTIVITIES BEFORE TAXATION

The directors received no emoluments in respect of their services to the company (2008: £nil).

There were no employees of the company during the period (2008: none).

Auditors' remuneration for the period has been borne by another company.

3. TAXATION

Factors that have affected the tax charge

The standard rate of Corporation Tax in the UK was changed from 20% to 21% with effect from 1 April 2008. This gives an overall blended Corporation Tax rate for the company for the period of 20.8%.
