ORDER

UPON the application by a Claim Form dated 6th October 2016 of Christopher Day the Claimant and former liquidator of the above named Castle Topco Limited (hereinafter called the "Company")

AND UPON READING the evidence

AND UPON HEARING Counsel for the Applicant and reading a letter from the Treasury Solicitor dated 2 December 2016

AND UPON IT APPEARING that there is no opposition on behalf of Her Majesty to the relief sought by this Claim as appears from the Witness Statement of Noelle Petty dated 23rd November 2016 and the exhibit thereto

BY CONSENT IT IS ORDERED that

- (1) The name of the above named Castle Topco Limited be restored to the Register of Companies
- (2) The Company do continue in Members' Voluntary Liquidation
- (3) If at the date of registration of this Order with the Registrar of Companies the said name is not available the Registrar of Companies shall pursuant to section 1033(2)(a)(ii) and (b) of the Companies Act 2006 change the name of the Company to 05988581 Limited



- (4) An office copy of this Order be delivered to the Registrar of Companies and the name of the Company thereupon be deemed to have continued in existence as if its name had not been struck off
- (5) The Registrar of Companies do advertise this Order in his official name in the London Gazette

AND UPON the Registrar of Companies neither objecting nor consenting

IT IS ORDERED that

- (6) Immediately upon the restoration of the Company the Applicant and Stephen Browne are appointed as Liquidator of the Company pursuant to section 108(1) of the Insolvency Act 1986
- (7) The Applicant and Stephen Browne are entitled to exercise their functions as liquidators jointly and severally
- (8) The costs of and occasioned by the application be treated as an expense of the liquidation
