#### REPORT ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### Our opinion

In our opinion, Trillium (RMH) Limited's financial statements (the "financial statements"):

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

#### 1. General information

Trillium (RMH) Limited ("the company") is a private company, limited by shares, and is incorporated in England and Wales. It acts as an investment holding company. The registered office is disclosed in note 7

#### 2. Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in compliance with the Companies Act 2006 and Section 1A of FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' ("FRS 102").

The financial statements have been prepared in Sterling (rounded to the nearest pound), which is the functional and presentational currency of the company.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies. The directors consider there to be no critical accounting estimates.

#### Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102:

- (i) preparation of a statement of cash flows in accordance with paragraph 1A.7 of FRS 102, on the basis that it is a small entity;
- (ii) preparation of a statement of changes in equity in accordance with paragraph 1A.7 of FRS 102, on the basis that it is a small entity;
- (iii) certain financial instrument disclosures in accordance with paragraph 1.12 (c) of FRS 102, on the basis the equivalent disclosures are included in a parent company's own consolidated financial statements. This information is included in the consolidated financial statements of Trillium Holdings Limited as at 31 March 2017.
- (iv) related party disclosures in accordance with paragraph 33.1A of FRS 102, on the basis that the company transacts with other wholly owned subsidiaries of the wider group.

#### **Statement of Comprehensive Income**

The company has not prepared a Statement of Comprehensive Income as the company did not trade during the years ended 31 March 2017 and 31 March 2016.

#### **Group accounts**

The company is itself a subsidiary company and is exempt from the requirement to prepare group accounts by virtue of section 401 of the Companies Act 2006. These financial statements therefore present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied consistently to all years presented unless stated otherwise:

#### 2. Accounting policies (continued)

#### Valuation of investments

Investments are carried at cost less any provision for impairment in value.

The carrying amount of the company's investment is reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income whenever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount of an asset is the greater of its net selling price and its value in use.
