1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards under the historical cost convention

The financial statements for the Company have been prepared on the going concern basis. The company relies on funding from its parent to meet its liabilities as they fall due. The Directors have received assurances from the parent entity that this funding will remain available for a period until at least 30 April 2014.

The parent entity sold the hotel property on 5 March 2013, therefore Roman Way Cannock Limited ceased trading on this date

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using tax rates and laws that have been enacted and substantially enacted at the balance sheet date

Stock

Stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less any further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life as follows

Fixtures and fittings 2 - 5 years

Fixtures and Fittings are capitalised and depreciated over their estimated useful lives between 2 and 5 years

Cashflow statement

The Company is exempt from the requirements of FRS1 (revised) and therefore has not prepared a cashflow statement as the results are consolidated into the accounts of the Osprey Limited Partnership who owns 100% of the share capital in the Company

Revenue Recognition

Revenue represents food and beverage sales, room rental and other fee income during the year Revenue and operating profit are both solely derived from continuing operations. The source of revenue is the United Kingdom

(c) Factors affecting future tax charge

The company has estimated gross trading losses arising in the period of £434,440 (year ended 31 December 2011 – loss of £493,928) that are available indefinitely for offset against future taxable profits of the same trade. The accumulated gross tax losses of £3,018,192 (year ended 31 December 2011 – £2,583,752) have not been recognised on the basis that it is unlikely that suitable taxable profits will arise from which the deferred tax assets can crystallise in the near future

It was announced in the Budget 2013 that the main rate of corporation tax effective from 1 April 2013 will be 23%. It is also currently expected that further reductions of 1% per annum will result in a decrease in the main rate of corporation tax to 21% from 1 April 2014.

If these changes had been substantially enacted at the balance sheet date, the deferred tax liability at 31 December would not have materially changed
