The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2010

#### PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the company during the year was the operation of a hotel. The directors consider the level of business and the financial position at the year end to be unsatisfactory and are working with the hotel operator in order to turn the business around quickly. Refurbishments and other expenditures of a capital nature have been carried out in the past year to improve the attractiveness of the hotel to customers.

#### PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks faced by the Company are credit risk and market risk. Credit risk is the risk that an issuer or counterparty will be unable or unwilling to meet a commitment that it has entered into with the Company. The risk is mitigated by the Company by taking deposits at the time of booking for larger functions and by securing bookings with credit cards. The company relies on funding from its parent to meet its liabilities as they fall due. The Directors have received assurances from the parent entity that this funding will remain available for a period until at least 31 August 2012.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

# Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards under the historical cost convention

The financial statements for the Company have been prepared on the going concern basis. The company relies on funding from its parent to meet its liabilities as they fall due. The Directors have received assurances from the parent entity that this funding will remain available for a period until at least 31 December 2012.

#### Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using tax rates and laws that have been enacted and substantially enacted at the balance sheet date

#### Stock

Stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less any further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value based on prices prevailing at the date of acquisition, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life as follows

# Fixtures and fittings 2 - 5 years

Fixtures and Fittings are capitalised and depreciated over their estimated useful lives between 2 and 5 years

# Cashflow statement

The Company is exempt from the requirements of FRS1 (revised) and therefore has not prepared a cashflow statement as the results are consolidated into the accounts of the Osprey Limited Partnership who owns 100% of the share capital in the Company

#### Revenue Recognition

Revenue represents food and beverage sales, room rental and other fee income during the year Revenue and operating profit are both solely derived from continuing operations. The source of revenue is the United Kingdom

# (c) Factors affecting future tax charges

The Finance (No 2) Act received Royal Assent on 27 July 2010 and announced a reduction in the main rate of corporation tax from 28% to 27% with effect from 1 April 2011 Deferred tax has therefore been provided at 27% It has since been announced that the corporation tax rate will change to 26% with effect from 1 April 2011

It is currently also expected that further reductions of 1% per annum will result in a decrease in the main rate of corporation tax to 23%, this is not expected to have a material effect on the deferred tax provided in the balance sheet

None of these changes have been substantively enacted by the balance sheet date
