REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS For the year ended 31 December 2019

The directors present their report and the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 December 2019.

CONSTITUTION

Fullabrook Wind Farm Community Interest Company is constituted as a Community Interest Company limited by guarantee. As such, the company must comply with the regulations laid down by the Regulator of Community Interest Companies.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity the company during the year was to make grants to assist in the provision of efficient energy, sustainable transport, recreational facilities, community safety and other public amenities for the benefit of people within the North Devon District and in particular those living near to the Fullabrook Wind Farm.

The directors meet about every six weeks to assess applications received for grant funding from community organisations in North Devon. The application process and the necessary forms are all available on the CIC's website www.fullabrook-cic.org which is constantly updated and also provides a list of all grants made to the present date.

RESULTS

Under a grant funding agreement with Devon Wind Power Ltd, the company receives an annual community fund grant of £100,000 in August of each year. In 2011, the CIC received an initial first year grant of £1,000,000 which is being spent over several years as agreed by the members at the first AGM. The CIC started this year with an unspent balance of £543,070 onto which was added the annual grant of £100,000 and a little interest.

Grants were made during the year of £98,158 as set out in notes 3,4 and 5 to the financial statements. Recipients of such grants are encouraged to fix a plaque buildings or equipment funded in this way to encourage others to apply for similar grants. In total, up to the end of December the CIC has given grants of £1,230,961 to local groups and organisations.

The CIC spent £8,377 on administration and finished the year with an unspent balance of £541,034.
