INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF BESTSHARE LIMITED

We have audited the financial statements of Bestshare Limited for the year ended 31 January 2009, set out on pages 5 to 9. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein and the requirements of the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

We also report to you whether in our opinion the information given in the directors' report is consistent with the financial statements.

In addition we report to you if, in our opinion, the company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding directors' remuneration and other transactions is not disclosed.

We read the directors' report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements within it.

BASIS OF AUDIT OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland) issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgments made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF BESTSHARE LIMITED

EMPHASIS OF MATTER

In forming our opinion on the financial statements, which is not qualified, we have considered the adequacy of the disclosure made in Note 1 to the financial statements concerning the company's ability to continue as a going concern. At 31 January 2009, the company's current liabilities exceeded its total assets by £944,797 (2008: £344,064) and included within current liabilities is an amount due to its parent company in the sum of £3,597,507 (2008: £3,401,191). The directors of the parent company have given an undertaking that they will not seek repayment of the inter-group liability until the company has sufficient cash reserves and that they will also continue to provide financial support. However, the financial support provided by the parent company is financed by bank loans provided by its bankers who are currently in administration and this has placed uncertainty over the parent company's ability to continue to provide this support.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JANUARY 2009

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

The company is dependent on the continued support of its parent company who have given an undertaking not to seek repayment of its intercompany loan of £3,597,507 (2008: £3,401,191) until the company has sufficient cash reserves. They have also given an undertaking to continue to provide financial support.

The parent company has financed the intercompany loan by bank borrowings, the cost of which is recharged to the company, and its bankers Kaupthing Singer & Friedlander (in administration) have intimated that it is not their intention to seek repayment of the facilities until 31 July 2010 subject to certain covenants being met. The parent company directors consider that they can meet these covenants and are confident that they will be able to secure alternative bank facilities on the expiration of the existing facilities on 31 July 2010. The directors therefore consider that the parent company is in a position to continue to provide this support.

The directors have also reviewed the projections and forecasts for the foreseeable future and are of the opinion that the income generated from the property owned by the company is sufficient to service the loan interest charged by the parent company and other expenses incurred.

Accordingly the directors are of the opinion that the financial statements are properly prepared on the going concern basis.

1.2 TURNOVER

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of goods supplied, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

1.3 STOCKS AND WORK IN PROGRESS

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs, together with capitalised interest cost and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

During the year, the parent company, Linkready Properties Limited, met expenses totalling £25,376 on behalf of the company, recharged interest of £265,937, and received repayments of £94,997. At the year end, the company owed £3,597,507 to Linkready Properties Limited (2008: £3,401,191), the balance of which is included within note 6.

10. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

The company's stock was sold after the year end at a loss of £1,117,112, of which a third party shares 50%. The directors are of the opinion that the financial statements have been properly prepared on the going concern basis because the company is continuing to actively look for further property dealings.

11. ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING AND CONTROLLING PARTY

The ultimate holding company is Linkready Properties Limited which controls 100% of the issued share capital.

The company regards Mr G Hesse, a director, and Mr R Collins as the ultimate controlling parties.
