MANAGING DIRECTOR'S REPORT For The Year Ended 30 June 2016

On behalf of the board of directors I am pleased to inform you of the results of Renewable Technical Services Limited for the twelve months to 30th June 2016.

During this period the Company achieved turnover of £3,865,474 and a profit of £169,258 before interest and tax.

This is an increase in turnover of 31% over the previous year. This EBIT figure includes a charge of £35,000 to cover costs incurred in obtaining a tax credit of £162,071 from HMRC in respect of Research and Development undertaken by the Company. This level of investment underpins the strategy that the future success of the Company will be driven by innovation and technical excellence. This means that the operational EBIT was in fact £204,258.

The move into EBIT profit vindicates the Company's strategy of securing long term framework agreements with all five of the major Wind Turbine OEMs. The Company has also widened its geographical footprint winning contracts in the USA, Canada, Mexico and Scandinavia, which reduces the effect of seasonality.

The year saw major contract wins in the UK both onshore and offshore with key industry giants such as MHI Vestas and Senvion, it also brought new contracts in Europe with Nordex and in the USA and Canada with International Wind. Our engineering field teams grew by 150% and further strength was added to the management structure to ensure the ongoing delivery of quality and commitment to our global client base.

The business has also invested heavily in technology, developing a highly efficient and safe means of a accessing turbine blades in situ, reducing down time. It is also in the process of developing a cloud based information system for real time use engineers and customers.

The current year has started well with record revenues in the first quarter, projecting a doubling of sales and a strengthening of margins. Taking into account new orders won and the high level discussions with customers for future work I am extremely confident that the business will report substantial growth in Revenue and an EBIT profit this year as well as generating a significant amount of cash reserves. This will enable the business to fund any increase in working capital as it grows and provide the investment required to ensure that the company can continue to provide a best in class service to its customers.

I can confirm that the Company has set a number of KPI's to be achieved in the coming year. These are;

- To be able to demonstrate an outstanding commitment to the health, safety and wellbeing of our employees
- To achieve significant growth in the business, maintaining margins and strengthening the financial position of the company
- To concentrate on providing more innovative technical services within our existing market areas by the further development of our core skills
- To continue to increase the training, skills and motivation of our workforce Finally, I would also like to pay tribute to the hard work and dedication of the entire RTS team, which has contributed to the successful development of the company and in positioning it to achieve even greater things in the coming year.

NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS For The Year Ended 30 June 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015).

Turnove

Turnover represents the value of services provided under contracts to the extent that there is a right to consideration.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Improvements to property

25% on cost

Plant and machinery

20% on reducing balance

Computer equipment

33% on cost

Motor vehicles
Office equipment

25% on reducing balance20% on reducing balance

Stocko

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Work in progress

Where the outcome of a long term contract can be estimated reliably, revenue and costs are recognised by reference to the stage of completion. This is measured by reference to the contract labour costs incurred to date as a percentage of the estimated total contract labour costs.

Where the outcome of a long term contract cannot be estimated reliably, contract revenue is recognised to the extent of contract costs incurred that it is probable will be recoverable. Contract costs are recognised as expenses in the period in which they are incurred.

When it is probable that the total contract costs will exceed total contract revenue, the expected loss is recognised as an expense immediately.

Progress payments received, when greater than recorded turnover, are deducted from the value of work in progress.

Deferred tax

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purposes and their treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred or accelerated is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences.

Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
