1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARING THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

TURNOVER

Turnover consists of the sale of antique artworks to customers and service charge receivable from fellow group companies. Revenue on artworks is recognised when the goods are delivered to the customer. The service charge receivable is based on a cost plus mark up basis and is an annual adjustment.
