The company incurred a net loss of £90,568 during the period ended 31 March 2008 and, at that date, the company's current liabilities exceed its current assets by £23,467. These conditions, along with other matters explained in note 11 to the financial statements, indicate the existence of a material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the company's ability to continue as a going concern. The financial statements do not include the adjustments that would result if the company was unable to continue as a going concern."
