Following the disposal of Pensions Security Limited Partnership's investment in the MEPC Fund Unit Trust on 28 March 2013 the Directors of Pensions Security GP Limited do not intend that the Partnership undertakes further investment activity

As a result the accounts have been prepared on the basis that the company is no longer a going concern. It is the intention of the directors that the company be dissolved as soon as practicable

1 Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with United Kingdom law and applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

The following principal accounting policies have been applied consistently through the year

As discussed in the Directors' Report, the investment of the Pensions Security LP in the MEPC Fund Unit Trust was disposed of on 28 March 2013 and it is not intended that the Partnership engage in any further investment activity, or that the company continue to trade. The accounts have been prepared on the basis that the company is no longer a going concern. No material adjustments have ansen from the preparation of the accounts on the basis that the company is no longer a going concern.

Investments

Investments represent interests in Pensions Security Limited Partnership. The investment is held at cost less provision for impairment

Cash flow statement

Under FRS1 Cash Flow Statement (revised 1996), the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a greater than 90% owned subsidiary undertaking of the BT Pension Scheme Consolidated financial statements for the BT Pension Scheme are available from the company's registered office

Under FRS 8 the company is exempt from the requirement to disclose related party transactions with Leconport Estates and its associated undertakings on the grounds that it is a wholly-owned subsidiary undertaking
