1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Authorisation

The financial statements of Milton 1 Limited for the year ended 26 February 2015 were authorised for issue by the Board of Directors on 4 Avgust 2015

1.2 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

1.3 Cash flow

The Company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 1.

1.4 Going concern

The financial position of the Company is set out in these financial statements. The Company has sufficient financial resources and, as a consequence, the directors believe that the Company is well placed to manage its business risks.

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.5 Investment income

Investment income is recognised when the right to receive the payment is established.

1.6 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

2. AUDITORS' REMUNERATION

Audit fees for the year were paid by the parent company, Whitbread Group PLC. Information about the total audit fees paid by the Group can be found in the Whitbread PLC Annual Report and Accounts for the year ended 26 February 2015.

3. STAFF COSTS

The Company has no employees other than the directors, who did not receive any remuneration (2014 - £NIL). All fees paid to directors as remuneration are borne by the parent company Whitbread Group PLC and it is not practical to allocate the amount for services in respect of this Company.

Factors affecting tax charge for the year

There were no factors that affected the tax charge for the year which has been calculated on the profits on ordinary activities before tax at the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK of 21.17% (2014 - 23.08%).

Tax treatment of the Company

The statutory accounts of Milton 1 Limited treat all income and expenses in the profit and loss account as income from fixed asset investments, arising from the Company's investment in Moorgate Scottish Limited Partnership. However, for tax purposes Moorgate Scottish Limited Partnership is treated as a transparent entity and as such the proportion of income and expenses attributable to Milton 1 Limited have been treated as though they arose directly in Milton 1 Limited.

Factors that may affect future tax charges

The Finance Act 2013 reduced the main rate of UK corporation tax to 21% from 1 April 2014 and to 20% from 1 April 2015. The effect of the new rate was included in the accounts for 2013/14.

Furthermore, it was announced in the Summer Budget 2015, that the government will reduce the corporation tax rate from 20%, to 19% in 2017 and to 18% in 2020. These Budget changes have not been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and consequently, in accordance with UK accounting standards, are not reflected in these financial statements. The rate changes will impact the amount of the future cash tax payments to be made by the Company.
