

Status and Administration

The Charity was incorporated on 23 April 2007, company number 6221863, and is a registered charity, number 1120940.

Objects

The objects of the Charity are:

1) To relieve poverty, sickness, distress or suffering by appropriate charitable (whether medical rehabilitive, financial or other) assistance in any part of the UK or elsewhere in the worked and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) by the provision of financial aid and/or distribution of food, medical, medical supplies, clothing, school supplies and other items of need to children whether victims of:

breaches of human rights;

any public calamity(including famine, earthquake or pestilence);

war or civil disturbance;

the immediate or continuing effects of lack of natural or other resources;

any other case of poverty distress or suffering;

- 2) to advance education and to promote social and economic development in any part of the UK or elsewhere in the world, particular but not exclusively, by working with and assisting members of local populations to build viable livelihoods, encouraging self-reliance and supporting sustainable projects initiated by the indigenous population;
- 3) to raise public awareness and advance public education here in the UK generally about the effects of public calamity (including famine, earthquake or pestilence), war or civil disturbance, lack of natural or other resources and poverty distress or suffering and in particular the effects on children; and
- 3) any other purposes deemed charitable under the laws of England and Wales

Appointment of Directors/Trustees

Directors and by definition, Trustees, are appointed in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Charity, a copy of which is held at the Registered Office and which may be inspected by appointment.

Review

The Charity was in its infancy during the period to 30 April 2008 and the Directors were largely concerned with finalising administrative arrangements. No grants were made as sufficient funding was not available.

Reserves Policy

There are no reserves at present.

Financial Results

The Directors are pleased to report that there was a surplus on the Unrestricted Fund for the period ended 30 April 2008. Donations received during the period amounted to £5,000.

The Directors are satisfied with the financial position of the Charity and confirm that they have adequate assets available to fulfil their obligations.
