## Directors' report

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2013

The directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies under s415A of the Companies Act 2006

#### Activities

The principal activity of the company is that of the acquisition of property on behalf of the Tottenham Hotspur group

### Going concern

The company is a property company with net current liabilities and net liabilities at 30 June 2013 and was loss-making during the financial year. The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis because the parent company, Tottenham Hotspur Limited, stated that it will provide the necessary financial support to the company for at least twelve months from the date these accounts are signed. The parent company directors prepare budgets and forecasts and have produced detailed and realistic cash flow projections which are reviewed on an ongoing basis. These demonstrate that the parent company has the financial capability to satisfy this obligation

### Dividends and results

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend in the current period (2012 £Nil) The company made a loss after tax for the year of £1,558,938 (2012 £278,706 profit), and the net liabilities as at 30 June 2013 were £1,340,018 (net assets 2012 £218,920) During the year, properties owned by Canvax Ltd were sold to TH Property Ltd, a company with which the company is under common control

The directors consider the future prospects of the company to be satisfactory

## Notes to the accounts Year ended 30 June 2013

### 1. Accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted, which have been applied consistently throughout the current year and prior year, are described below.

### Going concern

This is contained in the Directors' report on page 2

### Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

### Cash flow statement

Under the provisions of Financial Reporting Standard 1 (Revised) the company has not presented a cash flow statement, as its ultimate parent company, Tottenham Hotspur Limited, a company registered in England and Wales, prepares consolidated financial statements which include the results of the company and contain a cash flow statement

### Tax

The tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profits differ from net profit as reported in the profit and loss account because they exclude items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and they further exclude items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is the tax expected to be payable on the differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit and is accounted for using the balance sheet liability method. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable temporary differences and deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profits will be available against which deductible temporary differences can be utilised.

Deferred tax is charged or credited in the profit and loss account

### Turnover

Turnover represents rental income received from the letting of the company's properties Turnover is recognised as per the contractual terms of the rental agreements. All turnover arises in the United Kingdom

### Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment

Depreciation is provided on cost in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The rates of depreciation are as follows
