### TRUSTEES' REPORT

#### FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 2008

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the period ended 30th September 2008.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Worshipful Company of Plumbers' Plumbing Museum and Workshop Trust is constituted as a company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 21st May 2007. The company registered as a charity on 15 August 2007.

Prior to the establishment of The Worshipful Company of Plumbers' Plumbing Museum and Workshop Trust, the activities of the company were carried out by an unincorporated trust and registered charity, The Plumbers' Museum and Workshop Trust (charity number 283343), first established in 1981. The activities of the Trust were transferred to the Company on 1 October 2007.

The Worshipful Company of Plumbers' Plumbing Museum and Workshop Trust is governed by its Memorandum and Articles which establishes the objects and powers of the charitable company.

The charity was established with the following objects:

- 1. To take over the role of the unincorporated trust, The Plumbers' Museum and Workshop Trust (charity number 283343);
- 2. To advance the education of the public by the establishment and maintenance of a collection and exhibition of plumbing tools, artefacts, documents and plumbing crafts at the Weald & Downland Open Air Museum and other places;
- 3. The advancement and support of any educational object not inconsistent with the above mentioned objects.

### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to;

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will
  continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### REVIEW OF THE PERIOD

Volunteers with the necessary skills have been recruited during the year. This has enabled some thirty Craft Skill Demonstration days for the general public to be held. In addition a 'Master Class' of traditional lead casting was held for members of the plumbing industry and social events were held to raise funds to meet the costs of the Plumbing Museum.
