2. Progress to date

- 2.1 The receipts and payments account attached in Appendix I details the asset realisations to date
- 2.2 Realisations in the period total £8,421 45, and comprise £8,409 10 of cash from the Administration together with £12 35 of Gross Bank Interest
- The remaining asset in the Liquidation comprised a claim against Aqueduct Services Limited ("ASL") for an intercompany balance of £971,000 ASL is in Creditors' Voluntary Liquidation, and a claim lodged on behalf of the Company was formally rejected by the Liquidator of ASL in accordance with Rule 4 82(2) of the Insolvency Rules 1986. The decision to reject the claim was disputed, but I would advise that following a review of the position and the apparent lack of any material dividend prospects from ASL's liquidation, it was deemed that it would not be economical to pursue the matter further and there will be not be a recovery in respect of the debt owed to the Company
- My firm is in the process of obtaining a PAYE scheme registration for the Company to enable a preferential dividend to be processed to employees in respect of wage arrears and holiday pay shortfalls. Following the conclusion and payment of this, my firm's closing procedures will be instigated.

3 Investigations

An appropriate report/return on the actions of the directors has been forwarded to the Disqualification Unit of the Department for Business Innovation & Skills in accordance with the joint liquidators' statutory duties. Please note that the content of this report/return is of a confidential nature and so cannot be disclosed to third parties.

4. Joint Liquidators' remuneration and category 2 disbursements

- 4.1 At the Paragraph 58 creditors meeting held by correspondence, the following resolutions were passed
 - That the remuneration of the Joint Administrators be fixed by reference to the time properly given by the joint administrators and their staff in attending to matters arising in the administration in accordance with Rule 2 106(2)(b)
 - The Joint Administrators shall be authorised to draw their firm's internal costs and expenses in dealing with the estate, including photocopying, printing, facsimile, storage, mileage and room hire, as and when funds permit

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- 4.2 Accordingly, pursuant to Rule 4.127(5A) of the Insolvency Rules 1986, the remuneration of the Joint Liquidators is deemed to have been fixed under Rule 4.127(2)(b)
- The time costs incurred to date have arisen primarily as a result of continuing discussions with solicitors acting on behalf of S A Brain & Company Limited with regard to their alleged claim against the company and investigation into the background to the claim. Also dealing with Greencore regarding their contract and monies due in settlement of services provided. We have also dealt with the claim against Aqueduct Services Ltd, the statutory functions required under the Insolvency Act and Rules and also general enquiries from creditors and employees.
- A detailed breakdown of Joint Liquidators' time costs and category 2 disbursements, together with current charge out rates is attached in Appendix II. To date, fees in the sum of £10,372 50 have been drawn in respect of the Liquidation

5 Joint Liquidators' expenses

- 5.1 A schedule of all expenses incurred in the period has been detailed in Appendix III
- 5 2 Invicta Archive Storage Ltd have been retained to provide storage for the Company's physical books and records in the period under review they have been paid the sum of £1,267 50 to date in respect of this
- 5 3 GWT Media Ltd provided IT support services to the Joint Administrators and their invoice for these works has been paid in the sum of £900
- MacMillan Browne Limited have been retained as agents to provide logistical support in relation to the physical records of the Company in storage with Invicta Archive Storage Ltd. In the period they were paid the sum of £635 in respect of these services
- 5.5 JLT Speciality Limited provided insurance services to the Joint Administrators and latterly the Joint Liquidators, and their final invoice in respect of these services has been paid in the sum of £3,278.85

6. Creditors' rights

Within 21 days of receipt of this report, a secured creditor, or an unsecured creditor (with the concurrence of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors) or any unsecured creditor with the permission of the court may request in writing that the joint liquidators provide further information about their remuneration or expenses which have been itemised in the progress report

Within 14 days of receipt of the request, we must provide all of the information asked for, except so far as we consider that

- the time or cost of preparation of the information would be excessive, or
- disclosure of the information would be prejudicial to the conduct of the liquidation or might reasonably be expected to lead to violence against any person, or
- we are subject to an obligation of confidentiality in respect of the information.

We are also is required to give reasons for not providing all of the requested information

Any secured creditor, or an unsecured creditor (with the concurrence of at least 10% in value of the unsecured creditors) may, within 8 weeks of receipt of this progress report make an application to court on the grounds that the basis fixed for the joint liquidators' remuneration, the remuneration charged, or the expenses incurred by the joint liquidators as set out in the progress report are excessive

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7. Liabilities

7 1 Secured creditors

Lioyds TSB Bank plc have a fixed and floating charge debenture which was created on 9 June 2009 and registered at Companies House on 18 June 2009. As the charge post dates 15 September 2003, the Prescribed Part rules apply. At this stage no prescriber part has been calculated as realisations have been insufficient.

7.2 Preferential creditors

The estimated statement of affairs circulated in the Joint Administrators' Proposals showed estimated preferential creditor claims in respect of employees' holiday pay and arrears of pay totalling £62,963. A claim of £26,647 has been received from The Redundancy Payments Office, and the shortfall claims of the employees have been calculated to show further claims of £101,849. A dividend is anticipated to be paid to preferential creditors, and steps have been taken to apply for a PAYE scheme registration for the Company to enable the dividend to processed and paid

7.3 Unsecured creditors

I have received 115 unsecured non-preferential claims totalling £3,083,267, compared to £8,000,000 in the estimated statement of affairs

At this stage, there is no prospect of a dividend being payable to the unsecured non-preferential creditors
