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## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 31 August 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 August 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

#### Introduction

Wigan Athletic Community Trust was established as a registered charity in 2007 and now employs up to 60 staff who deliver community based activities across Wigan and the surrounding area that impact over 10,000 people each.

In September 2021, the charity moved to a new operational base at Robin Park Leisure Centre which is opposite the DW Stadium. The facility provided by Wigan Council consists of office and meeting space and a suite of classrooms.

The purpose of the charity as detailed out in its governing document is to:

- to further and assist in the education (on a social and physical basis) of children and adults within Wigan and surrounding areas (including without limitation, Ormskirk, St Helens and Rainford) without reference to race, religion and belief, sex, disability, nationality, ethnic or national origin or social background through the use of the game of football (including its history and rules) and other ancillary sporting activities as educational tools and in furtherance of that object to provide in Wigan and its surrounding area facilities for meetings, lectures and classes for the benefit of such children and adults;
- to provide or assist in the provision of sporting and recreational facilities for the public of Wigan and surrounding areas (including without limitation, Ormskirk, St Helens and Rainford) without reference to race, religion and believe, sex, disability, nationality, ethnic or national origin or social background, with the object of improving their conditions of life.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## Vision, Aims and Objectives

Wigan Athletic Community Trust has established three key outcomes that it works towards which form the basis of its vision to:

Work with Wigan Athletic Football Club to: Improve Health, Enhance Life Chances and Create Stronger Safer Communities.

Its activities cover three areas of operation: Schools, Community Development and Training and Skills, which aim to:

- Increase Participation in sport across all levels of society particularly those from underrepresented groups
- Encourage young people and families to lead healthier and more active lifestyles
- Improve the skills, aspirations and achievements of young people
- Contribute towards increased community cohesion by improving the quality of life of young people and families

### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

### Project and Activities during 2020/21

Between September 2020 and August 2021 Wigan Athletic Community Trust was able to support over 10,000 people across Wigan and its surrounding area - a remarkable effort given that for almost six months of this time the country faced Government imposed lockdown restrictions, due to Covid-19.

The period saw the Community Trust develop as a stronger and better-connected organisation with new partnerships created with local charities and organisations. This includes Wigan Athletic Supporters Club who are now heavily involved with the charity's work through the Supporters Project.

The charity supports residents in Wigan throughout their life course - from enabling children to be more school ready, through to making them life ready with education programmes in primary and secondary schools and then career ready with post 16 education and training courses.

It also provides additional support to more vulnerable young people, who need that extra help to improve their resilience and mental health or make positive choices around the lifestyles they lead so they stay away from negative behaviours that can affect the whole community.

### **School Based Activities:**

- Kids on the Move: Fitness programme for 3 to 4 year olds to improve their communication skills and personal development and help make them more school ready
- Primary Stars: Working with 102 primary schools offering a range of services including PE coaching, mentoring for teaching, football competitions, literacy, numeracy and PSHE lessons for pupils
- PE Coaching and After School Clubs: Supporting primary schools with their PE provision and providing affordable after school clubs in 20 different sports
- Premier League Inspires: Provides mentoring support to students at secondary school who are at risk of exclusion

### **Community Development Activities:**

- Kicks: Free football and sports coaching for 8 19 year olds in seven areas of Wigan, with sessions running at times when young people are at risk of becoming involved in anti-social behaviour
- Wigan Youth Zone: Football coaching for 8 19 year olds at £6million town centre youth centre
- Pathway 2 Participation: Mentoring scheme for 120 of the most vulnerable 12 19 year olds in Wigan
- Chances: Providing a range of targeted support to groups of young people with poor school attendance or at risk of involvement in crime and anti-social behaviour
- Holiday Activity Fund: Free holiday activities for children that also gives them the opportunity to receive a meal during the school holiday
- Every Player Counts: Football coaching for young people with disabilities both in school and out of school.
- Latics Soccer Schools: Affordable football courses for 6-14 year olds during school holidays
- Latics Dance Camps: Holiday courses for children between the ages of 6 14
- Football 4 Forces: Weekly football sessions for members of the armed forces community that are designed to improve their physical and mental health
- Extra Time: weekly social and physical activities for over 55's at the DW Stadium and venues across Wigan.
- Fit Latics/Lose Weight Feel Great for Men: Men's weight programme organised in partnership with ELF Trust, Sport England, Wigan Warriors and Wigan Council

## Training and Skills Activities:

- Level 2 and 3 Football and Education: Programme for unemployed 16 18 year olds
- Traineeships: 3 month work placements for unemployed 16 18 year olds
- Kick Start: Job creation programme for unemployed 16 24 year olds
- University of South Wales Foundation Degree
- NCS social action and volunteering scheme for 16 and 17 year olds

#### Achievements 2020/2021

#### **Improved Health**

Between September 2020 and August 2021:

- 99% of Under 5s experienced progress in physical activity, with 64% experiencing significant progress
- Provided 300 meals a day to children under 11 during school holidays
- 95% of Under 5s experienced progress in their social and emotional development with 51% experiencing significant progress
- 80% improvement in health amongst 8-18-year-olds
- 100% improvement in mental health and resilience amongst 12-18-year-olds
- 59% of Over 55s increased their physical activity levels

### **Enhanced Life Chances**

Between September 2020 and August 2021:

- 100% improvement in confidence and social skills of young people
- 80% improvement in behaviour in school
- 67 young people gained a business qualification
- 100% of level 3 apprentices went onto further employment or training
- 93% of level 2 students went onto further training

### **Stronger Safer Communities**

Between September 2020 and August 2021:

- 100% of participants on workshops have an increased knowledge of the consequences of violence and carrying a weapon
- 90% of young people referred for involvement in crime have not been involved in any incident for a 12-month period
- 67% of participants felt less socially isolated because of involvement
- 73% of participants felt less lonely and connected

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Financial Review

The 2020/2021 financial year was a positive period for Wigan Athletic Community Trust and it was able to increase its income by 16%.

Income for the full year was £1,364,917 (2020: £1,175,515) while expenditure for the period was £1,262,897 (2020: £1,249,768).

It was able to do this by attracting a range of new income from a diverse range of partners including Wigan Council, Sport England, the FA, DCMS and Big Issue Investment.

On top of the continued support of national partners the Premier League Charitable Fund and the EFL Trust this meant the charity was able to reverse the financial challenges it faced it the previous year caused by COVID-19 and the cancellation of delivery of large part of its services.

This additional funding and other savings made meant the Community Trust managed to end the 2020/2021 with a surplus of £102,020 (2020: deficit of £74,253).

An amount of £53,649 (2020: £84,792) relating to government grants and furlough scheme income is included as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

### Reserves policy

The Board of Trustees has established a reserves policy, in compliance with the Charity Commission guidelines, which it reviews annually. The trustees have determined that an appropriate level of 'free' (unrestricted) reserves, which are not invested in fixed assets, should ideally be sufficient to meet between 3-6 months operating costs; for 2021/22 this amounts to £315k (2020/21: £312k).

### **FUTURE PLANS**

In March 2021 Phoenix 2021 Limited became the new owners of Wigan Athletic FC, following a period of eight months in administration.

From the outset, the ownership group have recognised the critical role Wigan Athletic plays in the life of the town and have been committed to supporting and building on the work of the Community Trust.

Throughout the Club's period in administration, the backing of Wigan Council for the work of the Community Trust remained unwavering, and the partnership helped facilitate a move to new offices and classroom accommodation at Robin Park.

Looking forward, the next 12 months will see the Community Trust publish a new five year strategy which will help shape our future programmes.

In the shorter term, the charity is keen to work with the Football Club and other local businesses to help young people across Wigan find the training and employment opportunities that they deserve, while also helping people to become more physically active as we adapt to a post-COVID-19 world.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### **Governing document**

The Company is registered as a charitable company limited by guarantee and is governed by a Memorandum of Association.

### Organisational structure

The Community Trust is managed on a day to day basis by a Head of Community whose role is to provide leadership and strategic direction to the charity and oversee all operational activities involved its running including financial and governance compliance.

The Head of Community is supported by four senior managers with responsibility for Operations, Schools, Community Development, Training and Skills.

The charities Board of Trustees is made up 10 members with a broad range of skill and experience who meet every three months. New trustee representatives from Wigan Athletic FC and Wigan Athletic Supporters Club were added to the board during the year.

### Induction and training of new trustees

Each trustees receives a full induction before joining the Board which covers the Community Trust's Aim and Objectives as well as their roles and responsibilities as a Trustee.

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial statements of Wigan Athletic FC Community Trust (the 'charitable company') for the year ended 31 August 2021 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Statement of Financial Position, the Statement of Cash Flows and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. ## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 August 2021

### 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

Wigan Athletic FC Community Trust is a charitable company, limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered office address can be found in the Report of the Trustees.

### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable, except for those grants which are for a future specific period, in which case the relevant amount is deferred to that period.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category.

Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees.

### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Equipment - 25% on reducing balance

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

### **Taxation**

The Company is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Value Added Tax is not generally recoverable by the Charity and as such is included in the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities.

## Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the Company. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

### 2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

### Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value.

Related party loans have no stated interest rate, are payable within one year and are measured at the undiscounted amount due.

#### Government income

Government income comprises grants and subsidies provided as a direct result of the Covid-19 pandemic.

### 3. JUDGEMENTS AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

In the application of the charity's accounting policies, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experiences and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

These estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods.

### Critical judgements

At the end of the year, the trustees do not consider that there were any critical judgements which have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities.

### Key sources of estimation uncertainty

At the end of the year, the trustees do not consider that there were any key sources of estimation uncertainty which have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets and liabilities.
