The charitable objective of the organisation is to relieve hardship and poverty in the Pembrokeshire community.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Basics Banks

In June 2011 we opened our third base in Haverfordwest, we are now close to the ten most deprived areas in Pembrokeshire. In this financial year we have seen approximately a 100% increase in need for food parcels and clothing. We have also prevented tonnes of household and small electrical items from going to landfill by giving them to clients who would otherwise not have been able to afford such items.

Volunteers

We now have 45 volunteers many of whom were originally clients ranging from 3 to 80 years, 10 of whom are under 25. In November 2011 one of our youngest volunteers Rosalyn Wild, then aged 15, reached the top five of Channel 5 and CAF 'Britain's Kindest Kid'. She met David Cameron at Number 10 Downing Street, where she was presented with a certificate and a medal In May 2011 Sarah Picton reached the top three of Gwirvol's 'Wales' Most Inspirational Youth' and was presented with a certificate by the Welsh First Minister Carwyn Jones. PATCH did well in the local Voluntary Associations Volunteer Awards with the winners in the under 25 group award, the 'Mary Sigley' (where volunteering has made a huge difference to the life of a volunteer) and also in the over 25 individual volunteer award. We also received highly commended in the trustee and under 25 individual awards.

Christmas toy project

Our second toy project was launched in October 2011 With help of many individuals, churches and large companies we gave gender appropriate gifts to over 340 children. The parcels were made up and delivered entirely by volunteers

Website

The charity has a website, www patchcharity org uk which gives information on the activities carried out by the charity to potential donors and informs those individuals that require assistance of what services are available to them PATCH can also be found on Facebook and Twitter.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The reserves held at the end of the year are £18,949 surplus (2011 - £8,514 surplus)

PLANS FOR FUTURE YEARS

Our plans for the future include hosting a Christmas Day 2012 Lunch along with the Mayor of Milford Haven, which will be for people who may otherwise be alone on Christmas Day
