STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

AFC Bournemouth Community Sports Trust is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on October 11, 2007 and registered as a charity on February 8, 2008. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

Appointment of trustees

The trustees who are directors for the purpose of company law and trustees for the purpose of charity law, who served during the year and up to the date of this report, are set out on page 2 New trustees are appointed upon the recommendation of existing trustees. One third of the trustees must retire at each annual general meeting and offer themselves for re-election

Risk management

The Board of Trustees are aware of the required procedures involved in the recruitment of staff prior to employment

Strict procedures are necessary when working with children under the age of sixteen years. These procedures prior to recruitment of staff include CRB checks, verification of qualifications and an interview process. The Trustees are involved in these procedures when deemed appropriate

In addition procedures are in place to ensure compliance with Health and Safety regulations by all staff, volunteers and clients. The Trust has an appointed safety officer and appropriate risk assessments covering the specific activities and projects are in place.

The procedures and formats are periodically reviewed and assessed to ensure that they continue to meet the needs of the Trust to fulfil its responsibilities

Organisational structure

Day to day responsibility for the provision of services rests with the head of the Community Sports Trust, Steve Cuss, a qualified FA and UEFA coach and a team of coaches Jamie Dighton, Russell Beardsmore and Connor Natella All administration is undertaken by Anne Cuss. Paul Topping and Patrick Wilson are responsible for the programme of activities on the Isle of Wight

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT

The Trust's objective is the promotion of community participation in healthy recreation, in particular by the provision of facilities for the playing of football. The aim is to help young people, especially but not exclusively through leisure time activities, so as to develop their capabilities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society. Also, to provide or assist in the provision of sporting and recreational facilities for the public of Bournemouth and surrounding areas without reference to race, religion and belief, sex, disability, nationality, ethnic or national origin or social background, with the object of improving their conditions of life

The trustees confirm that they have had regard to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities

The Trust carries out these objects by providing a wide range of football related activities and is supported by the Football League Trust whose four core themes are social inclusion, community cohesion, health and education and sports participation

It actively supports both the community and AFC Bournemouth, providing everyone within the community opportunities to get involved and using the power of football to deliver inspirational, progressive and professional initiatives that follow the accessible, stylish and friendly values of the Club, which maximise the opportunities for local talent, and make a positive, real and lasting difference to the community within which the Club operates

Schools Programme

The Trust continues to grow and delivers sessions under its schools programme across Bournemouth, Poole, Christchurch, Purbeck, Isle of Wight and the surrounding areas to over 3,000 children per week, visiting more than 70 schools. Many of the sessions are football-based, however the Trust's staff are qualified in a variety of sports allowing us to offer multi-sport sessions as well. All of these points have enabled the Trust to become the number one deliverer of sports development across. Dorset and Hampshire

School visits take place all over the region with three main clubs, Breakfast Club, which runs for an hour before school, Lunchtime Club, which runs for 45 minutes during school lunchtime and the very popular After School Club, which runs for one hour after school All of these clubs are for boys and girls, covering all school age years.

These six week programmes include coaching on passing, control, dribbling, heading, shooting combined with fun games and small sided matches.

In addition to the regular schools programme other activities include.

Planning, Preparation and Assessment

PPA sessions are offered to cover lessons at schools by taking over PE lessons and also using the time to deliver different projects such as Healthy Eating and Anti Smoking Schemes to the children. The Trust has partnerships with many different schools to deliver these sessions in Bournemouth, Poole and the surrounding areas, visiting some schools up to 3 times a week.

Soccer Schools

The Trust runs its popular Soccer Schools during all school holidays in Bournemouth, Purbeck and Wimborne They are fun football sessions aimed at children of any ability, aged 7-14 years. All courses are run by qualified and experienced coaches who are first aid trained and CRB checked.

Saturday Soccer Club

The Trust offers clubs for children aged 4-14 years old, every Saturday morning,

Minikickers

Minikickers are football coaching sessions aimed at boys and girls aged 4,5 and 6 years old. The sessions run every Saturday morning on the training pitches at the AFC Bournemouth Goldsands Stadium.

Soccer Tots

The Trust has launched a new Saturday morning session at Wimborne Town FC. The session runs weekly at Cuthbury, Wimborne Town's ground

Bournemouth and Poole and Isle of Wight Colleges Coaching academy Levels 1 & 2

The Trust is working in partnership with Bournemouth and Poole College and more recently the Isle of Wight College, in delivering FA and BTEC courses in Sport and Sports Development, First Aid, Employability Skills and Functional Skills From September 2012 the course was extended to Year 1 and Year 2 students.

In addition to academic study, students receive coaching to improve their fitness and progress their technical skills and tactical awareness. All students play competitively for the Academy in weekly league and academy matches

In addition to the above the Trust has also been involved in the following projects and activities

npower - Respect and What's Your Goal

The charity has received funding from npower for the Respect campaign and the What's Your Goal programme which seeks to support young peoples' employment opportunities for the future.

Powerstrike

Powerstrike is a portable inflatable shooting area which records shot speeds and has been used prior to matches and on school visits and has helped the charity to raise additional funds

Futsal

The new Futsal and Education programme started in September 2012

Goals

This is a social inclusion project for 13-17 year olds and is designed to offer coaching sessions as a constructive use of spare time for the age group, reducing anti-social behaviour

Princes Trust partnership - Get started with Football

The Trust continues to work in partnership with the Princes Trust to provide coaching sessions and courses for the FA Junior Football Organisers Award and Emergency Aid Awards for groups of 16-24 year olds

National Citizen Service

The Trust continued with the National Citizen Service project, which aims to give every school leaver the chance to learn skills that will help them to make a positive contribution to their community, during the year

The project involved 45 young people taking part in residential activities, outdoor challenges, community regeneration projects and social action tasks

Kick 'n' Swing

A joint activity between the Trust and a local golf club to provide golf and football sessions during the school holidays

Europartner

The Trust runs football coaching programmes for German exchange students visiting Bournemouth during the summer. Over 350 German teenagers aged 12-17 take part in the sessions every year, which fit around their English lessons. As part of the course, the students are also given a tour of the stadium, to see all the facilities that the Goldsands Stadium has to offer its players

Disability programme

The Trust plays Pan-Disability, which is where players play together regardless of their disability players are put together by ability rather than age. Training takes place twice a week in both Bournemouth and Isle of Wight and is open to anyone with any form of disability.

Matchday packages

Match Day Packages have been increasingly popular with youth football teams and other youth organisations, with groups in to enjoy the package on most home games over the past few seasons Now AFC Bournemouth are a Championship side we believe this popularity will increase further.

Match Day Packages are aimed at boys and girls aged 7-16 years old Starting at 11am the group will be given a tour of the Goldsands Stadium by a member of the Trust's staff, showing them the dressing rooms and executive areas Before going out to either the AFC Bournemouth training pitches or Kings Park field for some fun coaching games and penalty shoot outs. At around 2pm the group will be taken to their seats in the East stand of the stadium to enjoy all the pre-match build up and watch an AFC Bournemouth league game.

Birthday parties

The Trust regularly holds football birthday parties for children on Saturdays and weekdays during school holidays

Traditional Party

A two hour birthday party held at the Goldsands Stadium on Saturdays (non-match days only) The party includes a tour of the stadium, where the guests get to see the changing rooms and walk out the tunnel pitch-side and view the dug-out area. They also go over to Kings Park for some fun football activities, including small-sided matches and a penalty shoot out.

Kids Cup and Girls Cup

The prestigious npower Football League Girls and Kids Cups are delivered at all 72 affiliated Football League Clubs throughout England and Wales

The primary schools' under 11's and 13's npower Football League Girls and Kids Cup competitions are run by the individual Football League Clubs. The winners of each local tournament then go forward to represent their local clubs at the regional finals. Each competition is run at divisional level with a regional southern and northern final being staged. The winners of each regional final then compete in a grand final before one of the play off finals in May at Wembley.

Apprenticeships

The Trust offers a unique opportunity for 16-18 year olds to participate in an 'Activity Leadership Apprenticeship'

The apprenticeship includes working a 30 hour week, within the Community department Adopting a coaching role the apprentices visit the local schools alongside full-time members of the Trust's staff to coach a variety of sessions to children of different ages

During the year-long apprenticeship, as well as working in the community, apprentices are also required to complete assessments, working towards a City & Guilds/NVQ in Activity Leadership. A successful first year on the apprenticeship scheme provides the opportunity to progress onto the second year, and possible jobs within the Trust

The scheme has been partly funded by Aspire Sports and the Mitre Group.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The net expenditure for the year amounted to £7,597 which together with the accumulated funds brought forward leave funds of £39,090 to be carried forward.

Reserves

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds to the level required to provide sufficient funds to cover administration costs

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

The partnerships with Bournemouth and Poole College and the Isle of Wight College will continue and the range of activities provided on the Isle of Wight will be expanded.

The Trust has recently secured new sponsorship from Time Business Systems to re-launch the popular Healthy Lifestyle Programme which will be delivered over the coming year

The Trust has also been selected as a provider for the ongoing National Citizen Service programme for 2013, which will be offered to 16 and 17 year old boys and girls from the Isle of Wight

Agreement to provide a combination of football activities and education concerning internet safety involving children and parents in a project to be called Connect with Care has also been reached with C4L recently.

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in the furtherance of the general objectives of the Trust

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the Trust is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income

- Investment income is included when receivable
- Incoming resources from charitable activities are accounted for when earned
- Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the Trust earns the right to consideration by its performance

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the Trust in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the Trust and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the Trust
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

National Citizen Service

The Trust continued the National Citizen Service project, which aims to give every school leaver the chance to learn skills that will help them to make a positive contribution to their community, during the year
