The Company continues to operate at the interface between community, public and private stakeholders within the built environment, working with all of these groups to achieve good outcomes in the planning and design of developments and places for the benefit of local residents and the wider communities impacted by change.

Processes involving Design Review and Enabling have again been provided during the year.

Design Review in Cornwall is provided as a partnership between ourselves and Cornwall Council and the sessions have been expanded to include the involvement of parish council representatives as observers to the process, in order to inform and educate them about design considerations.

Enabling work has included providing advice to the RNLI in terms of supporting a competitive design initiative entitled 'Designing Out Drowning' based in Newquay, Cornwall. We have attended steering group meetings ahead of the competition which is due to be held late spring 2019.

Organisational support has continued to be offered to community groups exploring the possibility of creating a Conservation Area in the city centre of Plymouth, and this resulted in the creation of a new Area relating to the 20th century city core.
