Directors' Report for the year ended 31 December 2020

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2020.

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of a holding company. The company owns the entire share capital of Inspiredspaces STaG (Projectco1) Limited. This company develops and operates projects under the Government's Building Schools for the Future scheme.

The directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies entitled to the small companies' exemption. Both the level of business and the year end financial positions were in line with budgets and expectations.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The profit for the financial year was £82,000 (2019: £55,000).

Both the level of business and the year end financial positions were in line with budgets and expectations.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company will continue to act as holding company to Inspired spaces STaG (Projectco 1) Limited.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks facing the business are that the value of investment in the undertaking, which is dependent on the success of the underlying project. The directors manage this risk through close involvement in the management of the underlying project and regular monitoring of its performance.

DIVIDENDS

The directors have recommended the payment of an interim dividend of £82,000 (2019: £55,000).

GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which the directors consider to be appropriate for the following reasons.

The Company exists to hold an investment in an underlying project that provides services under certain private finance agreements. The Company's ability to meet its debts as they fall due is dependent on the performance of the Company's interest in Inspiredspaces STaG (ProjectCo1) Limited (the project). The Directors have reviewed the cash flow forecasts of the project covering a period of at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements which indicate that, taking account of severe but plausible downsides including the impact of COVID-19, the project will have sufficient funds to meet its liabilities as they fall due for that period and to operate within the covenants on its external borrowings.

Specifically, the directors have considered if, in modelled severe but plausible downside scenarios, the level of operational performance of the project would lead to service failure points being awarded against the project in accordance with the terms of the project's contract with the local authority sufficient to cause an event of default under the terms of the project's external borrowings. To date, taking into account the effect of COVID-19 there has been no material adverse impact on the project's cashflows, or the service levels provided and no indication of heightened risk of subcontractor failure. As a result, the cashflow forecasts indicate that, even in downside scenarios, the project will be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due.

Consequently, the Directors are confident that the Company will have sufficient funds to continue to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements and therefore have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

There have been no material post balance sheet events which would require disclosure or adjustment to these statements.

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Inspired spaces STaG (Holdings1) Limited ("the company") for the year ended 31 December 2020 which comprise the Statement of Comprehensive Income, Balance Sheet, Statement of Changes in Equity and related notes, including the accounting policies in note 1.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 December 2020 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with UK accounting standards, including FRS 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) ("ISAs (UK)") and applicable law. Our responsibilities are described below. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities under, and are independent of the company in accordance with, UK ethical requirements including the FRC Ethical Standard. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is a sufficient and appropriate basis for our opinion.

Going concern

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the going concern basis as they do not intend to liquidate the company or to cease its operations, and as they have concluded that the company's financial position means that this is realistic. They have also concluded that there are no material uncertainties that could have cast significant doubt over its ability to continue as a going concern for at least a year from the date of approval of the financial statements ("the going concern period").

In our evaluation of the directors' conclusions, we considered the inherent risks to the company's business model and analysed how those risks might affect the company's financial resources or ability to continue operations over the going concern period.

Our conclusions based on this work:

- we consider that the directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting in the preparation of the financial statements is appropriate;
- we have not identified, and concur with the directors' assessment that there is not, a material uncertainty related to events or conditions that, individually or collectively, may cast significant doubt on the company's ability to continue as a going concern for the going concern period.

The company is subject to laws and regulations that directly affect the financial statements including financial reporting legislation (including related companies legislation), distributable profits legislation and taxation legislation and we assessed the extent of compliance with these laws and regulations as part of our procedures on the related financial statement items.

Whilst the Company is subject to many other laws and regulations, we did not identify any others where the consequences of non-compliance alone could have a material effect on amounts or disclosures in the financial statements

Context of the ability of the audit to detect fraud or breaches of law or regulation

Owing to the inherent limitations of an audit, there is an unavoidable risk that we may not have detected some material misstatements in the financial statements, even though we have properly planned and performed our audit in accordance with auditing standards. Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with UK Accounting Standards, and are presented in pounds sterling which is the functional currency of the company. All amounts in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest £1,000.

Statement of compliance

Inspired spaces STaG (Holdings 1) Limited is a private limited company incorporated in England. The Registered Office is 3 More London Riverside, London, SE1 2AQ. The financial statements have been prepared in compliance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland ("FRS 102") and the Companies Act 2006 for the year ended 31 December 2020.

The financial statements contain information about Inspired spaces STaG (Holdings 1) Limited, as an individual company and do not contain consolidated financial information as the parent of a group. The company is exempt under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertaking are included by full consolidation in consolidated financial statements of its International Public Partnerships Limited Partnership

The Company's parent undertaking, International Public Partnerships Limited Partnership includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of International Public Partnerships Limited Partnership are prepared in accordance with IFRS and are available to the public and may be obtained from 3 More London Riverside, London, SE1 2AQ. In these financial statements, the company is considered to be a qualifying entity (for the purposes of this FRS) and has applied the exemptions available under FRS 102 in respect of the following disclosures:

- Reconciliation of the number of shares outstanding from the beginning to end of the period;
- Cash Flow Statement and related notes; and
- Key Management Personnel compensation.

As the consolidated financial statements of International Public Partnerships Limited Partnership include the equivalent disclosures, the Company has also taken the exemptions under FRS 102 available in respect of the following disclosures:

- The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Section 33.1 A Related Party Disclosures not to disclose related party transactions between two or more members of a group provided that any subsidiary which is a party to the transaction is who lly owned by such a member.
- The disclosures required by FRS 102.11 Basic Financial Instruments and FRS 102.12 Other Financial Instrument Issues in respect of financial instruments not falling within the fair value accounting rules of Paragraph 36(4) of Schedule.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Taxation

Taxation for-the-year comprises current tax and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly equity. Current taxation assets and liabilities are not discounted. Current tax is recognised at the amount of tax payable using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Balance Sheet date.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which the directors consider to be appropriate for the following reasons.

The Company exists to hold an investment in an underlying project that provides services under certain private finance agreements. Investments in subsidiaries

Investment in subsidiary undertakings are recognised at cost less provision for any impairment in value.

Short term debtors and creditors

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income in the administrative expenses.

Interest-bearing loans and borrowings

All interest-baring loans and borrowings which are basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar loan. After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Dividend income

The entity recognises a dividend from a subsidiary, joint venture or associate in profit or loss and in its financial statements when its right to receive the dividend is established

Interest receivable and similar income

Interest receivable is credited to the profit and loss account as it is earned.

Interest payable and similar charges

Interest payable is charged to the profit and loss account as it is incurred.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amount reported for assets and liabilities as at the balance sheet date and the amounts reported for revenues and expenses during the year. However, the nature of estimation means that actual outcomes could differ from those estimates. There are no significant estimates or judgements in the preparation of these financial statements

2. EMPLOYEES AND DIRECTORS

The company has no employees and hence there were no staff costs for the year ended 31 December 2020 (2019: £nil). The directors received no remuneration, fees or other benefits in the performance of their qualifying services in respect of their services to the company (2019: £nil).

Amounts owed to group undertakings comprise loan stock of £874,000 (2019: £888,000) from Building Schools for the Future Investments LLP and £623,000 (2019: £646,000) from BSF Newco Limited. In 2020 Inspiredspaces STaG Limited was restructured out of the project structure, leading to Building Schools for the Future Investments LLP increasing holdings by 1%, Gateshead Council by 0.5%, South Tyneside Council by 0.5% and Amber LEP Investments by 8%.
