### Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and was formed on 28th November 2007. It is governed by a memorandum and articles of association. The liability of the members in the event of the company being wound up is limited to a sum not exceeding £1.

The trustees of the charity are also the directors for the purposes of company law and are appointed by the members at the AGM

### Objectives and activities

### The charity's objects

HALE aims in all it does to promote the physical, social and mental health wellbeing of the general public by the provision of training, one to one support, exercise, nutritional advice and other activities to those who need them by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances, with the overall object of improving their conditions of life and the social fabric of the community in which they live

### The charity's main activities

HALE worked with over 2000 people last year, addressing health and wellbeing issues in the Shipley constituency, and Frizinghall and Heaton areas of Bradford

This year we have seen the introduction of the mobile outreach venue that enables HALE to engage communities directly around sexual health and cook and eat. It is also an opportunity for HALE to build partnerships beyond the Shipley boundary, and we have found that children's centres across Bradford are now engaging with health and wellbeing activities through HALE. The promotional events using the bus have significantly increased the numbers of people that we have engaged

Through its Food and Nutrition work HALE has increased the numbers of people who have benefited from one to one support in home cooking, and has set up two cook and eat programme's as drop ins. We have maintained the allotment work, but have reduced the amount of time delivering food growing projects. We have built up an excellent partnership with Kirkgate Studios who deliver an Eco Mind project and help to maintain the site. Hot Wheels is a new cook and eat programme, which makes use of the Mobile Outreach Venue for cooking awareness in local communities. In total we have worked with 436 people around cooking food. Exercise classes continue to be something that is very important for HALE to deliver – with 146 attendees to this service.

Oral health remains an essential piece of work to be done with parents of under 5's, and we have also been able to train parents and volunteers to deliver the work

The sexual health outreach work including relationship programme's such as CLASH and Speakeasy has helped us to work with over 300 young people, as well as training young people to be peers for STI screening. The mobile outreach venue has also been used to deliver the Friday night in Parks programme, which makes HALE one of the leading organizations in screening for STIs and distributing the C-card

The demand for the networker programme has continued to increase, seeing over 260 people this last year. This has been directly supported by the Befriender's project that has recruited 45 volunteers and supported 32 people to be befriended. In addition the Stepping Stone programme has developed and supports asylum seekers, new arrivals and refugees to engage in community activities.

Through funding from the Shipley Area Committee we have distributed a total of 19 grants to community groups across the Shipley constituency promoting health and wellbeing ranging from exercise classes to extra tutors for horse riding for disabled people to birthing pools to gardening tools. This grant also enables HALE to host and support the Creative Solution events and to establish the Health and Wellbeing Hub

### Achievements and performance

HALE has successfully secured another 2 years commission from the NHS and the local authority as well as a two year grant from Lloyds TSB Foundation that will ensures HALE continues to be in a strong financial position. The Mobile Outreach Venue is going from strength to strength and enables us to have a resource that is a benefit to the whole community of Bradford and surrounding areas.

HALE has increased its partnership working and this is signified by the success of Kirkgate Katchup (a midwife drop in) which we have now been able to replicate in the Frizinghall area of Bradford with the support of the midwife team, Surestart and the children centres

### Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of health

### Financial review

The net expenditure after transfers for the year was £6,984, including net income of £32,000 on unrestricted/designated funds and net expenditure of £38,984 on restricted funds

### Reserves policy

A reserves policy was agreed by the trustees on 24th September 2009

It is the view that we should have sufficient funds to enable HALE to exist for a period of time (three months), to enable the development of alternative funding streams

The reserves at 31st March 2011 were £62,055

### Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees report and the financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and UK Accounting Standards

### Notes to the accounts

### for the year ended 31 March 2011

### 1 Accounting policies

### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice. Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year No changes have been made to the accounts for previous years

### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability

### Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources

Where grants are related to performance and specific deliverables, they are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance

### **Expenditure and liabilities**

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out the resources

### Taxation

As a charity the organisation benefits from rates relief and is generally exempt from income tax and capital gains tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates

### Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £500 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition. Gifted assets are shown at the value to the charity on receipt. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic lives as follows.

Project and office equipment over 1 year

Computer equipment over 1 year

Motor vehicles over 4 years

### **Pensions**

The charity operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees. The costs of contributions are recognised in the year they are payable.

### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular purposes

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the accounts
