1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been used in dealing with items that are considered material in the financial statements. They have been applied consistently throughout the current and prior year.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified by the revaluation of certain investment properties, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

McCarthy & Stone Investment Properties No 23 Limited was formed to invest in property McCarthy & Stone Investment Properties No 23 Limited's finance is provided through intercompany balances. The Group is headed by McCarthy & Stone Limited which is funded by banking facilities. The Group has confirmed that it will not seek repayment of intercompany balances within 12 months of signing the statutory accounts of McCarthy & Stone Investment Properties No 23 Limited. The Directors are in receipt of a letter of support from McCarthy & Stone Limited. The Directors are satisfied that the facilities and operations of the Group are sufficient to provide the assurances held within this letter. Accordingly, the accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis.

Investment properties

Investment properties represent rental properties and are valued at a multiple of the rent receivable

In accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice 19, investment properties are normally revalued annually and the aggregate surplus or deficit is transferred to a revaluation reserve, no depreciation or amortisation is provided in respect of freehold investment properties and leasehold investment properties with over 20 years to run. Although the Companies Act would normally require the systematic annual depreciation of fixed assets, the Directors believe that this policy of not providing depreciation is necessary in order for the accounts to give a true and fair view, since the current value of investment properties, and changes in that current value, are of prime importance rather than a calculation of systematic annual depreciation. Depreciation is only one of many factors reflected in the annual valuation and the amount which might otherwise have been shown cannot be separately identified or quantified.

Income tax

Income tax comprises current tax and deferred tax

Current tax is based on taxable profits for the year

Deferred tax is recognised on all temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements, with the following exceptions

- In respect of taxable temporary differences associated with investments in subsidiaries, associates and joint ventures, where the timing of the reversal of the temporary differences can be controlled and it is probable that the temporary differences will not reverse in the foreseeable future, and
- Deferred income tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, carried forward tax credits or tax losses can be utilised

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply when the related asset is realised or liability is settled, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

Income tax is charged or credited directly to equity if it relates to items that are credited or charged to equity. Otherwise, income tax is recognised in the income statement

Cash flow statement

No cash flow statement has been prepared for the Company as it is itself a wholly owned subsidiary A Group consolidated cashflow statement is included in the accounts of McCarthy & Stone Limited
