The directors present their Strategic Report for the year ended 31 March 2016.

Business review

Burberry (Spain) Finance Limited (the "Company") is a wholly owned subsidiary of Burberry Group plc (the "Group"). The Company's principal activity is to act as a holding company.

The Balance Sheet on page 7 of the financial statements shows that the Company is in a net asset position at the year end consistent with the prior year.

Future developments

At the date of this report the directors do not anticipate any major changes in the Company's activities in the next year.

First time application of FRS 100 and FRS 101

In the current year the Company has adopted Financial Reporting Standard 100 (FRS 100) and Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' (FRS 101). In previous years the financial statements were prepared in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

This change in the basis of preparation has materially altered the recognition and measurement requirements previously applied in accordance with UK GAAP. An explanation of the impact of the adoption of FRS 100 and FRS 101 for the first time is included in note 1.1.

Principal risks and uncertainties

From the perspective of the Company, the principal risks and uncertainties are integrated with the principal risks of Burberry Group plc and are not managed separately. Accordingly, the principal risks and uncertainties of Burberry Group plc, which include those of the Company, are discussed on pages 56 to 61 of the Group's 2015/16 Annual Report which does not form part of this report.

Financial risk management

From the perspective of the Company, financial risk management is integrated with the financial risk management of Burberry Group plc and is not managed separately. Accordingly, financial risk management of Burberry Group plc, which include those of the Company, is discussed on pages 155 to 157 of the Group's 2015/16 Annual Report which does not form part of this report.

Key performance indicators

The directors of Burberry Group plc manage the Group's operations on a consolidated basis using key performance indicators. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that analysis using key performance indicators for the Company is not necessary or appropriate. The development, performance and position of Burberry Group plc is discussed in the Financial Review section of the Group's 2015/16 Annual Report which does not form part of this report.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

Burberry (Spain) Finance Limited is a holding company. The Company is a limited company incorporated and domiciled in the UK. The address of its registered office is Horseferry House, Horseferry Road, London, SW1P 2AW.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' and the Companies Act 2006. As permitted under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006, group financial statements have not been prepared as the Company is itself a wholly owned subsidiary of another company (see note 7).

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 101 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 2).

Financial Reporting Standard 101 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The change in basis of preparation has enabled the Company to take advantage of some of the available disclosure exemptions permitted by FRS 101 in the financial statements, the most significant of which are summarised below:

- the requirements of IFRS 7, 'Financial Instruments: Disclosures';
- the requirement in paragraph 38 of IAS 1, 'Presentation of financial statements' to present comparative information in respect of:
 - paragraph 79(a)(iv) of IAS 1;
- the requirements of the following paragraphs of IAS 1 'Presentation of financial statements':
 - 10(d) (statement of cash flows);
 - 10(f) (a statement of financial position as at the beginning of the preceding period when an entity applies an accounting policy retrospectively or makes a retrospective restatement of items in its financial statements, or when it reclassifies items in its financial statements);
 - 16 (statement of compliance with all IFRS);
 - 38A (requirement for minimum of two primary statements, including cash flow statements);
 - 38B-D (additional comparative information);
 - 40A-D (requirements for a third statement of financial position);
 - 111 (cash flow statement information); and
 - 134-136 (capital management disclosures).
- the requirements of IAS 7 'Statement of Cash Flows';
- the requirements of paragraphs 30 and 31 of IAS 8 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors' (requirement for the disclosure of information when an entity has not applied a new IFRS that has been issued but is not yet effective);
- the requirements of paragraph 17 of IAS 24 'Related Party Disclosures' (key management compensation);
- the requirements in IAS 24 'Related Party Disclosures' to disclose related party transactions entered into between two or more members of a group, provided that any subsidiary which is a party to the transaction is wholly owned by such a member; and
- the requirements of paragraphs 134(d)-134(f) and 135(c)-135(e) of IAS 36 'Impairment of Assets'.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

First time application of FRS 100 and FRS 101

In the current year the Company has adopted FRS 100 and FRS 101. In previous years the financial statements were prepared in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

This change in the basis of preparation and therefore the application of International Accounting Standard 21 'The Effects of Changes in Foreign Exchange Rates' has led to a change in the functional and presentational currency of the Company from Euro to Sterling. This change has materially altered the recognition, measurement and disclosure requirements previously applied in accordance with UK GAAP. No other changes resulted from the adoption of FRS 100 and FRS 101.

1.2 Going concern

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

1.3 Investments in subsidiaries

Investments in subsidiaries are measured at cost less accumulated impairment.

1.4 Impairment

Investments are not subject to amortisation and are tested annually for impairment. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use. Investments for which an impairment has been previously recognised are reviewed for possible reversal of impairment at each reporting date.

1.5 Foreign currency translation

Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates (the functional currency). The financial statements are presented in Sterling which, following the transition to FRS 101, is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

Transactions in foreign currencies

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into the functional currency at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies, which are held at the year end, are translated into the functional currency at the exchange rate ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences on monetary items are recognised in the Income Statement in the period in which they arise.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

1.6 Taxation

Tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax charge.

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the Income Statement because it excludes items of income or expense which are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items which are never taxable or deductible. The liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates which have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

1.7 Called up share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Incremental costs directly attributable to the issue of new shares or options are shown in equity as a deduction, net of tax, from the proceeds.

2. Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

Preparation of the financial statements in conformity with FRS 101 requires that management make certain judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities and the disclosure of contingent liabilities. If in the future such estimates and assumptions, which are based on management's best judgements at the date of the financial statements, deviate from actual circumstances, the original estimate and assumptions will be updated as appropriate in the period in which the circumstances change.

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. The key area where the estimates and assumptions applied have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying value of assets and liabilities is discussed below:

Impairment of investments

Investments are reviewed for impairment if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. When a review for impairment is conducted, the recoverable amount is determined based on the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use calculations prepared on the basis of management's assumptions and estimates. Refer to note 10 for further details of investments.

3. Profit on ordinary activities before taxation

The directors did not receive any emoluments in respect of their services to the Company (2015 - £nil).

The Company has no employees and therefore no employee costs are included in these financial statements (2015 - £nil). The Company has not been recharged audit fees of £1,300 (2015 - £1,300) as these were paid by Burberry Limited.

As such, Burberry (Spain) Finance Limited does not recognise a tax (credit)/charge for any (losses)/profits to the extent that there are sufficient profits/(losses) within the UK Group companies to fully offset Burberry (Spain) Finance Limited's UK liability.

The tax assessed for the year does not differ from the standard rate of corporation tax in the UK of 20% (2015 - 21%).

Factors that may affect future tax charges

There were a number of changes in the UK corporation tax system announced in the July 2015 Budget Statement and later in the March 2016 Budget. The main rate of corporation tax will change to 19% from 1 April 2017 and will further change to 17% from 1 April 2020. These changes were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015 and 6 September 2016 respectively.
