

We have audited the financial statements of QH Enterprises Holdings Limited for the period from 30 January 2011 to 28 January 2012, which comprises the Profit and Loss Account, the Balance Sheet, the Principal Accounting Policies on page 5 and the related notes 1 to 12. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion the information given in the Directors' Report for the financial period for which the financial statements are prepared is consistent with the financial statements.



Principal Accounting Policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with United Kingdom applicable accounting standards

The principal accounting policies of the company have remained unchanged from the previous period and are set out below

The company has a deficit of shareholders funds at 28 January 2012. The directors consider it appropriate for these financial statements to be prepared on a going concern basis as the company's parent undertaking has indicated that it will not call for repayment of amounts due to the group undertakings without first ensuring that the company has adequate funds to meet its obligations as they fall due.

QH Enterprises Holdings Limited is a wholly owned subsidiary of Harrods Group (Holding) Limited (formerly Qatar Holding UK Limited) which produces Group accounts in accordance with the Companies Act 2006. Consequently the company has taken advantage of the exemption permitted by section 400 of the Act from producing Group accounts. These accounts therefore present information about the company and not about its group.

Harrods Group (Holding) (formerly Qatar Holding UK Limited) produces a consolidated cash flow statement in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (FRS1). Consequently the company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS1 from producing a cash flow statement.

Investments

Investments are included at cost less provision for impairment where appropriate.

The company is an indirect 100% subsidiary of Qatar Holding LLC which is the strategic investment arm of Qatar Investment Authority, the ultimate controlling party.
