12 Related party transactions and balances

Uberior Ventures Limited, a member of Regenco Properties LLP up to 12 November 2012, is itself a subsidiary undertaking of the group headed by the Lloyds Banking Group plc

At 31 December 2012, the company was owed £49,000 (2011 - £Nil) by UWRI Limited Partnership, a member of Regenco Properties LLP

At 31 December 2012, the company owed £347,733 to URWI Newco Borrower Limited, a subsidiary company of URWI Limited Partnership

In the opinion of the directors there are no other related party transactions to be disclosed

12 Controlling party information

At 31 December 2012, the company's ultimate controlling entity was West Coast Capital, a Scottish partnership trading from Marathon House, Olympic Business Park, Drybridge Road, Dundonald The directors of Regenco Borrower Limited are also partners of West Coast Capital

An immediate parent entity of the company is Regenco Properties LLP, which is the parent of the smallest group of which the company is a member and for which consolidated accounts are prepared and are filed at Companies House
