### Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2019.

### **Directors**

The names of the present directors of the Company and who served throughout the year and up to the date of signing are shown on page 1.

### Directors' indemnities

The Company has qualifying third party indemnity provisions for the benefit of its directors which remained in force throughout the year and at the date of this report.

### Results and dividends

The audited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2019 are set out on pages 9 to 17. The financial statements have been prepared under Financial Reporting Standard 101 ("FRS 101").

As shown in the Statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income on page 9, the Company's profit for the financial year ended 31 August 2019 was £39,750,000 (2018: £42,719,000).

The Company paid dividends in the year of £43,000,000 (2018: £40,000,000). During the year, the Company received dividends of £43,000,000 from subsidiary undertakings (2018: £45,000,000).

Details on the future developments of the Company are given in the Strategic report on page 6.

### Going concern and financial risk management

### Statement of directors' responsibilities in respect of the financial statements

The directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulation.

Under that law the directors have prepared the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards, comprising FRS 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework", and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing the financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- state whether applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards, comprising FRS 101, have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006.

### Strategic Report

The Strategic report is prepared in accordance with s414(c) of the Companies Act 2006.

### Business review, principal activities and key performance indicators

The Company principally acts as a holding company for a group of trading and non-trading companies.

As shown in the Company's Statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income on page 9, the Company's profit for the financial year ended 31 August 2019 was £39,750,000 (2018: £42,719,000).

The balance sheet on page 10 of the financial statements shows that the Company's net asset position is £106,181,000 (2018: £109,431,000), a decrease of £3,250,000, reflecting the profit for the year offset by dividends paid. Details of the amounts owed by and to other group undertakings are shown in Notes 7 and 8 on page 16.

The Company's directors believe that further key performance indicators for the Company are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business. The performance of the Group, of which this Company is a part, is discussed in the WH Smith PLC Annual Report and Accounts 2019, which does not form part of this Report.

### Principal risks and uncertainties

The WH Smith PLC group manages its operations, including WH Smith High Street Holdings Limited on a divisional basis and has identified the following factors as major potential risks to the successful performance of the business of the Group. Many of these factors are applicable to WH Smith High Street Holdings Limited.

- Economic, political, competitive and market risks
- Brand and reputation
- · Key suppliers and supply chain management
- Store portfolio
- Business interruption
- Reliance on key personnel
- International expansion
- Treasury, financial and credit risk management
- · Cyber risk and data security

Group risks including risk management are discussed in further detail within the Principal risks and uncertainties section of the Strategic report in the Group's Annual Report and Accounts 2019, a copy of which is available on the Group's website at www.whsmithplc.co.uk which does not form part of this report.

All principal business functions compile risk registers and summary risk maps to identify key risks, assess them in terms of their likelihood and potential impact, and determine appropriate control strategies to mitigate the impact of these risks taking account of risk appetite. The ongoing monitoring of this framework is overseen by the respective Business Risk Committees and the Group Audit Committee. During the year, the Group Board reviewed the effectiveness of the Group's risk management and internal controls systems. This review included the discussion and review of the risk registers and the internal controls across all business functions, as part of an annual exercise facilitated by the Internal Audit team. During the year, the Group Board also received presentations from management on specific risk areas such as cyber risk, international expansion, and the ongoing risk monitoring processes and appropriate mitigating controls.

## **Strategic Report (continued)**

#### **Brexit**

Following the UK referendum to leave the EU, there will be a period of uncertainty until an agreement on exit has been agreed between the UK and the EU. The extent to which our operations and financial performance are likely to be affected in the longer term should therefore become clearer as details of this agreement emerge.

Where the consequences of Brexit may impact the business, we have incorporated these considerations into our assessment in relation to each of the principal risk headings listed above.

Our Brexit Working Party continues to review and monitor these issues, as part of our ongoing Risk Management framework. This includes consideration of those risks that could arise in the event of a possible 'no deal' outcome, where we continue to work closely with our suppliers to manage the impact of any amendments in tariff and duty rates, changes to import procedures for EU imports, and availability.

### Financial Risk Management

The Company's operations expose it to a variety of financial risks that include the effects of foreign exchange rate risk and interest rate risk. The Company is subject to the WH Smith Group policies to ensure proper monitoring and control of financial risk. The policies are set by the Group and are implemented by the Company's finance department.

The Group's treasury function seeks to reduce exposures to interest rate, foreign exchange and other financial risks, and to ensure liquidity is available to meet the foreseeable needs of the Group and to invest cash assets safely and profitably. The Group does not engage in speculative trading in financial instruments and transacts only in relation to underlying business requirements. The Group's treasury policies and procedures are periodically reviewed and approved by the Group's Audit Committee and are subject to regular Group Internal Audit review. Further information on the Group's financial risk management policies and procedures are given in the WH Smith PLC Annual Report and Accounts 2019, which does not form part of this report.

### Liquidity risk

The Company manages its exposure to liquidity risk by reviewing the cash resources required to meet its business objectives through both short and long-term cash flow forecasts.

The Group has a policy of pooling cash flows in order to optimise the return on surplus cash and also to utilise cash within the Group to reduce the costs of external short-term funding.

### Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that a counterparty may default on their obligation to the Company in relation to lending, settlement and other financial activities. The Company's principal financial assets are trade and other receivables and bank balances and cash.

The Company has credit risk attributable to its trade and other receivables. The amounts included in the balance sheet are net of allowances for doubtful receivables.

The carrying amount of financial assets recorded in the financial statements represents the Group's maximum exposure to credit risk. The Company does not hold collateral over any of these financial assets.

### Interest rate risk

The Company is exposed to cash flow interest rate risk on floating rate intercompany loans.

### Foreign currency risk

Foreign exchange rate risk is the risk that the fair value of future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of the changes in foreign exchange rates. As an intermediate holding company in a group of companies which engage in retailing with overseas operations the Company is indirectly exposed to foreign currency risk. The Company's foreign currency exposures are principally to the US dollar.

The Group uses forward foreign exchange contracts to hedge significant future transactions and cash flows denominated in currencies other than pounds sterling. The hedging instruments have been used to hedge purchases in US dollars and to minimise foreign exchange risk in movements of the USD/GBP exchange rates. These are designated as cash flow hedges. At 31 August 2019, the Group had no material un-hedged currency exposures.

### **Strategic Report (continued)**

### Going concern and future developments

The Company's business activities, together with factors that are likely to affect its future developments, performance and position are detailed within this Strategic report. The financial position of the Company and its liquidity position are described in the financial statements and notes. The WH Smith PLC Annual Report and Accounts 2019 includes further information regarding the Group's financial position, cash flows and borrowing facilities, as well as its policies and processes for managing its capital; its financial risk management objectives; details of its financial instruments and hedging activities; and its exposures to credit risk and liquidity risk. The Strategic report of the WH Smith PLC Annual Report and Accounts 2019 also highlights the main risks and uncertainties facing the Group, a copy of which is available on the Group's website at www.whsmithplc.co.uk.

The directors report that they have reviewed current performance and forecasts, combined with expenditure commitments, including capital expenditure and borrowing facilities. In addition the directors are in receipt of a letter of subordination from its parent company, WH Smith Retail Holdings Limited, releasing the Company from the commitment to pay the liabilities due to them for at least a twelve month period from the date of signing of these financial statements. After making enquiries the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue its current operations, including contractual and commercial commitments for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they have adopted the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements. No changes in its principle activities is foreseen.

## Report on the audit of the financial statements Opinion

In our opinion, WH Smith High Street Holdings Limited's financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 August 2019 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards, comprising FRS 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework", and applicable law); and

### Basis for opinion

## Notes to the financial statements Year ended 31 August 2019

### 1. Accounting policies

A summary of the principal accounting policies is set out below.

### General information

WH Smith High Street Holdings Limited is a private company limited by shares, incorporated in the United Kingdom and domiciled in England and Wales.

### **Accounting convention**

The financial statements of WH Smith High Street Holdings Limited have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101, 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' (FRS 101).

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost basis and are in compliance with the Companies Act 2006 as applicable to companies applying FRS 101 and applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards.

All accounting policies have been applied consistently in the current year and the prior year, except as noted below and under "new standards adopted in the year."

### **Basis of preparation**

The financial statements are for the year ended 31 August 2019. The prior year financial statements were for the year ended 31 August 2018.

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of WH Smith Retail Holdings Limited and of its ultimate parent, WH Smith PLC. It is included in the consolidated financial statements of WH Smith PLC which are publicly available. Therefore the Company is exempt from producing consolidated financial statements under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis as explained in the Strategic report on page 6.

As permitted by FRS 101, the Company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions available under that standard in relation to financial instruments, capital management, presentation of comparative information in respect of certain assets, presentation of a cash-flow statement, standards not yet effective and certain related party transactions.

Where relevant, equivalent disclosures have been given in the group financial statements of WH Smith PLC. The group financial statements of WH Smith PLC are available to the public and can be obtained as set out in Note 12.

### New standards adopted in the year

The Company has adopted the following standards and interpretations which became mandatory during the current financial year. These changes have had no material impact on the Company's financial statements:

- IFRS 9 Financial Instruments
- IFRS 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers

### Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are accounted for at cost less, where appropriate provisions for impairment. The carrying value of investments in group undertakings is reviewed for impairment if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

### **Taxation**

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The Company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

### 1. Accounting policies (continued)

Basis of preparation (continued)

### Dividends payable and receivable

Final dividends are recorded in the financial statements in the period in which they are approved by the Company's shareholders. Interim dividends are recorded in the period in which they are approved and paid.

Dividends receivable from subsidiaries are recorded in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income in the period in which they are received.

### Interest payable

Interest payable and similar charges are recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and allocating the interest expense over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability to the net carrying amount of the financial liability.

#### Financial instruments

### a) Trade receivables

Trade receivables are measured at initial recognition, do not carry any interest and are stated at their fair value and are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. Appropriate allowances for estimated irrecoverable amounts are recognised in the income statement when there is evidence that the asset is impaired.

### b) Financial liabilities and equity

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the Company after deducting all of its liabilities.

### c) Equity instruments

Equity instruments issued are recorded at the proceeds received, net of direct issue costs.

### 2. Critical accounting judgements and sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expense, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from these estimates and any subsequent changes are accounted for with an effect on income at the time such updated information becomes available.

In preparing these financial statements, no areas of critical accounting judgement or key sources of estimation uncertainty have been identified. Management have concluded that the critical accounting judgement and key sources of estimation uncertainty that were reported in the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2018 would no longer result in a material adjustment in the next 12 months.

## Notes to the financial statements (continued) Year ended 31 August 2019

### 3. Operating result

The Company had no employees (2018: none). The remuneration of S Clarke and R J Moorhead is disclosed in the consolidated financial statements of WH Smith PLC for the year ended 31 August 2019 and no allocation of their services, as directors of WH Smith High Street Holdings Limited and other Group companies, is made. None (2018: none) of the other directors received any remuneration in either the current or the previous year in respect of their services to the Company.

Auditors' remuneration for the audit of the statutory financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2019 amounted to £1,500 (2018: £1,500), and was borne by another group company and not recharged in both the current and previous year. There were no non-audit fees. Statutory disclosures in respect of non-audit fees for the group are given in the consolidated financial statements of WH Smith PLC.
