Talk shows:

- Talking Newspaper: A show aimed at blind & visually impaired listeners.
- College Matters: The Frome College Radio Club made by and for all students at Frome College.
- Doc Miller's Medical Hour and Staying Alive: shows produced and presented by local health practitioners.
- All About Frome: Highlighting the role of the voluntary & community sector in Frome.

Music shows:

Rebellious Jukebox, Match&Fuse, Magic Eye Radio, Space Folk Horror Show,
 Orient Express, and many others: Shows bringing their own take on music, with a special preference for local bands and musicians.

· Magazine shows:

- Somerset Cool, a new show featuring people and activities from all over Frome and Somerset. The show's presenter, Jenna Miles, was awarded New Comer of the Year at the 2019 Community Radio Awards.
- The Saturday Sizzler has gone from strength to strength highlighting all things local
 from local community affairs to traffic and what's on listings.
- Teenage Kicks presented by members of the Frome College Radio Club for a teenage audience highlights and discusses all the issues that are upmost in the minds of the younger generation.

Throughout the year we have provided training to new and prospective members on quality broadcasting – this has included meeting Ofcom standards, technical audio skills, and presenting skills.

Our activities have benefited the community in a number of ways, including:

- Enabling people to learn new skills, including hard skills (such as audio production and editing) and soft skills (such as building confidence and working in teams).
- Promoting engagement with the local community sector, including volunteering and take up of services.
- Bringing people from different backgrounds together through the promotion of community events.
- Promoting the local creative sector by acting as an outlet for musical and spoken word artists.
