REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE PERIOD 21 MAY 2008 TO 30 APRIL 2009

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company and the group for the period 21 May 2008 to 30 April 2009.

INCORPORATION

The group was incorporated on 21 May 2008.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the group in the period under review were those of security services, domiciliary care and training services.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

We have undertaken an analysis of the group companies' activities and performance and closing year end position. Our review has considered the market conditions prevailing, the opportunities and risks that each company has encountered during the year and we have anticipated what could occur going forward.

The subsidiaries were acquired in May 2008 so the comparative figures relate to periods when they were not within the group.

Phoenix Security UK Limited

The principal activity of the company has been, and will continue to be, the supply of door supervisors to the licensed trade in the UK.

During the year sales, gross and net profit margins before tax were :-

Sales during the financial year were better than expected, taking into account the economic downturn within the leisure industry. This was achieved primarily due to focusing on our existing customers, offering the highest standard of service possible.

The gross profit has increased. However, the margin achieved for 2009 is more in line with our expectations; whereas the margin in 2008 was lower than was expected.

The net profit margin has increased, primarily due to the increase in the gross profit margin; overheads before tax, depreciation and finance charges have increased slightly by 1.7%. However, this was within expectations.

The financial year ahead will be a difficult one as the recession bottoms out, but, as in the last financial year, the directors feel we will buck the trend, with sales increases of at least what was achieved in 2009, as well as retaining the gross profit and net profit margin achieved in the current financial year moving forward.

Phoenix Eye Limited

The principal activity of the company has been, and will continue to be, the supply of security guards, stadium security and close circuit television installation, maintenance and monitoring. The emphasis will be on the migration of sites with a physical guard to a monitored C.C.T.V system.

Sales during the financial year have increased significantly but this is due to the 2008 period being for a short period from 4 September 2007.

The gross profit margin is within the expected range.

The net profit margin has increased. However, we can draw little information from the prior year comparison with such low sales over the period. The current level of net profit is acceptable as a percentage of sales; however we are anticipating an increase in the next financial year.

The financial year ahead will be a good one and we expect to increase sales by 35%. The gross profit margin will be retained and the net profits will increase in line with the increase in sales.

Executive Training Solutions Limited

The principal activity of the company has been, and will continue to be, the delivery of training programmes within the security sector with the emphasis on train to gain, encompassing national vocational qualifications and skills for life.

During the year sales, gross and net profit margins before tax were :-

Sales during the financial year have increased by 95%. However, the percentage increase is understated as the 2008 period was for a shorter period of 6 months. This growth was primarily due to an increase in the customer base.

The gross profit margin is within the expected range even though there has been some erosion as a comparison with the 2008 figures. The level of the 2008 margin was not sustainable and has reduced primarily due to the increase in staffing levels required to support the back office support structure.

The net profit margin has increased, due primarily to the increase in sales.

The financial year ahead will be similar to the last one in all areas of sales and margin.

Care Line Homecare Limited

The principal activity of the company has been, and will continue to be, the supply of carers for the provision of domiciliary care to local authorities and private individuals.

During the year sales, gross and net profit margins before tax were :-

Sales during the financial year have increased by 29%. However, the percentage increase is far higher if you factor in the 17 month period used as a comparison for the previous period. This growth was due to organic growth as well as the acquisition of another domiciliary care business in October 2008.

The gross profit margin is within the expected range, even though there has been some slight erosion. This was primarily due to some disparity in pay rates as a result of the acquisition of the new business which has now been addressed.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS FOR THE PERIOD 21 MAY 2008 TO 30 APRIL 2009

The net profit margin has increased, primarily due to the increase in volume sales, resulting in the overhead/salary cost of the administration side of the business reducing as a percentage of the turnover.

The financial year ahead will be a good one and we expect to increase sales by 50%, with 40% coming from the acquisition of the domiciliary care business purchased in October 2008 and 10% through organic growth. The gross profit margin will be retained and the net profit will increase in line with the increase in sales.

The directors consider the group results for the period and the period end position to be satisfactory.

DIVIDENDS

No dividends will be distributed for the period ended 30 April 2009.

Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and the group and of the profit or loss of the group for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's and the group's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and the group and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and the group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Basis of consolidation

The results of all subsidiaries are included in the group profit and loss account from the date of acquisition under the acquisition method of accounting.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Goodwill

Purchased goodwill is amortised by equal annual instalments over its estimated useful life of 5 or 10 years.

Goodwill arising on consolidation is the excess of purchase consideration over fair value of the assets of the companies acquired. In the consolidated accounts the amount of goodwill is capitalised and amortised over 20 years, which, in the opinion of the directors, is the period the company will derive the economic benefit from this goodwill.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Radios

- 25% on reducing balance

Plant and machinery

- 20% on reducing balance and

15% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on cost and

20% on reducing balance

Motor vehicles

- 25% on reducing balance and

25% on cost

Office equipment

- 25% on reducing balance,

25% on cost and

20% on reducing balance

Stocks

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Cost includes all direct expenditure and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
