Governing document

The charitable company is controlled by its governing document, Memorandum and Articles of Association

The charitable company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the charitable company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding $\mathfrak{L}1$

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

A new trustee or new trustees may be appointed at any time (either by way of replacement or addition), but so that the total number of trustees shall at not be less than two

A trustee may be appointed or discharged by a decision of the trustees by an ordinary resolution or of a meeting of the members

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the company shall be to foster and develop the arts in the unitary council area of Milton Keynes (hereafter called the area of benefit)

Significant activities

To provide funding and support for the arts to individuals and organisations in Milton Keynes or whose projects are based in Milton Keynes. To promote the arts in Milton Keynes by way of Networking Events and a regular Newsletter

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

1 A year of change

The year was a highly significant one for the new organisation. The "old" Milton Keynes Arts Association was replaced by Arts Gateway MK, a limited liability chanty, and launched on 1st May, 2009. This has involved re-branding, acquiring a new web domain, creating a new website, and designing and producing new letterheads, new publicity literature, and new application forms and procedures.

2 Launch of new Organisation

To assist with our launch and re-branding, we were given a supplementary grant of £8,000, in addition to the basic grant award of £17,000 by Milton Keynes Council, our major funder. This enabled us to employ a marketing assistant for the period leading up to the launch in May as well as paying for the launch itself.

3 Funding Activities -

Funding Organisation, Groups and individuals is our core activity. We have 3 Grant Rounds per year. 1st of February, 1st of May and the 1st of October and therefore 3 Awards Meetings per year where the final Award decisions are made by our Executive Committee. All applications are assessed by our specialist panels in Music, Dance, Literature, Visual Arts and Drama.

During the year to date we delivered grants to a large number of individuals and organisations In summary

4 Application Procedures

We have revised the following

- " all our grant application forms and procedures to make them clearer for applicants,
- " our guidelines to applicants,
- " our guidelines to Panel members

These procedures will be subject to a further review during the coming year, following testing and feedback from applicants and the Awards Panel members and the Awards Panel Chairs

5 Networking Events

With the assumption that the economic climate is likely to deteriorate during the year, and with the encouragement of the Arts team at Milton Keynes Council, we started a programme of networking events called "Mingles" to expand the levels contact and collaboration between individual arts practitioners and local arts groups. The Mingles are informal networking events, including an opportunity for information and practise to be shared through a series of performances and presentations. The feedback from attendees has been entirely positive, and these events will occur quarterly throughout the coming year to become a fixture in the local Arts calendar.

As an additional part of our services to the local Arts community, we have expanded the scope and dramatically increased the circulation of our weekly E-Newsletter, which gives news on artistic events and initiatives in Milton Keynes, and enables groups and individuals to promote their events on the AGMK website

6 Community Arts Resource Centre

As part of the services to be provided by AGMK, we have created The Community Arts Resource Centre (CARC) as a new Community Interest Company (CIC) This has been operating from a small industrial unit in Stacey Bushes, rented from Milton Keynes Community Properties at a subsidised rental

A grant from the Milton Keynes Community Foundation has allowed us to invest in storage racking and long span shelving for the CARC, as well as hangers, dust covers, labelling equipment, we have also completed the move of costumes from the Bath House Costume Store, and have been gifted the funds of £1,300 from the same source

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

While this process has been going on, we have audited, listed and stored the stock of equipment, and discovered that some of it has been randomly acquired, not as the result of any market research. This has led to the current situation where a substantial amount of stock is either unsuitable for hire (in need of repair), is outdated, or needs to be sold because it generates too little income (an example of this is the stock of drums and guitars)

The CARC is operating on a break even basis, and the plan will be to move into a surplus during the next financial year In addition, we have commissioned a Business Plan for the CARC with the aid of funding from Business Link essential in our pursuit of increased funding from new sources

7 Additional Services

We continue to provide information to new and aspiring and developing artists across the range of arts. This information is provided by our Administrator, our Panel Chairs and our Panel Members, and forms an important part of our added value to the local community

8 Organisational Development

Our Current Chairman has announced his intention to step down as Chair during the next financial year, and a shortlist of candidates is being compiled. Now that the necessary structural changes for Arts Gateway MK have been completed, a candidate is sought who will have the necessary interest in the Arts and business expertise, combined with vision and strategic planning skills, to move the organisation forward in the current and future challenging financial climate. The new Chair will identify and recruit additional members to the Board of Trustees with the necessary expertise to guide Arts Gateway MK towards a sound and secure future

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life
