STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charty is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The charity was established by the four members and it is not their intention to recruit any further trustees

Induction and training of new trustees

During the processes involved in forming and incorporating the charitable company the trustees sought professional advice in the administration of the charity's activities and trustee responsibilities under charity taw. On an ongoing basis, professional advice is sought as considered necessary by the trustees. Going forward it is not anticipated that there would be any new trustees, therefore formal procedures on the induction and training of new trustees are not considered to be necessary.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Organisational structure

The charity has no employees and all decisions are taken by the trustees (after obtaining professional advice if considered necessary) in accordance with the governing document. Decisions are taken by way of meetings of the members and each issue is decided by a majority of the votes cast. Each member is entitled to one vote.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

Through its grantmaking activities the charity seeks to assist others in providing much needed assistance to those in need of medical and humanitarian assistance, and provide opportunities to those who are seeking to improve their skills

Significant activities

From prudent maintenance of funds over the years of The Take That Trust, we have been able to make many donations to other charitable organisations this year. We have donated funds across a broad spectrum of charitable causes including music and the arts, health including mental health, protection from violence, helping young people and promotion of community groups.

Although the charity is showing a large deficit for the year, this needs to be read in the context of the charity as a whole. The donation income is not necessarily distributed out in the year that it is received because the trustees need to have had the opportunity to consider who should be the beneficiaries of the funding. This has been undertaken on a larger scale this year and funds that had been allowed to build up have been distributed, which has brought about the deficit.

The trustees have considered each of the causes and have donated a total of £290,000 this year, which amounted to virtually all of the reserves held. They were able to do this as, with no paid employees and no expenses or other payments to trustees, only a very small percentage of funds are expended on administration of the charity. These funds are targeted at the key functions of the administration so as to minimise any inefficiency.

The resulting efficiency has led to the vast majority of funds having been made available for charitable giving. This has amounted to just over a quarter of a million pounds over the life of the Trust.

Grantmaking

The charity's trustees discuss and evaluate the activities of potential recipients of grant monies and consider the consistency of their objects and activities with those of the Take That Trust. The charity seeks to make a positive difference from all of the grants that it advances, and this is reflected by the trustees considering the expected changes that the recipient intends to make as a direct result of receiving the income

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The Trust would like to extend its thanks to those who have donated funds during the year and recognise the fundraising by independent fundraisers

The trustees have had due regard to the guidance published by the Charity Commission on public benefit

FINANCIAL REVIEW

At the period end, after having distributed most of its funds to charitable causes, the charity held net resources of £1,686. It is the view of the trustees that on the one hand it is prudent and responsible for the charity to hold resources for distribution but on the other when the charity wishes to distribute funds it can do so, in the knowledge that there are no regular administration commitments placing demands on its funds

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 July 2012 set out on pages five to nine

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Chanties

Exemption from preparing a cash flow statement

Exemption has been taken from preparing a cash flow statement on the grounds that the charitable company qualifies as a small charitable company

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Resources expended

Expenditure, which is inclusive of irrecoverable input VAT, is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities and recognises its expenditure without the recovery of input tax

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements
