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DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for CBPE Holdings Limited (company registration no. 06647571) for the year ended 31 March 2022.

This directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to companies entitled to the small companies exemption.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The company acts as a holding company for CBPE Limited, CBPE Capital Feeder Fund GP Limited and CBPE GP Limited. The company is also a participating member of CBPE Capital IX GP LLP and CBPE Capital X GP LLP ('the LLPs'). As such, the company is entitled to a share of the profits of the LLPs.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The result for the year is set out in the statement of income and retained earnings on page 6. The position of the company at the year end is set out in the balance sheet on page 7.

The profit before tax for the year is £482,946 (2021 – £384,089). The directors paid dividends of £1,950,347 (2021 – £nil) during the year. The retained profit of £482,946 (2021 – £384,089) has been transferred to reserves.

The objectives of our audit are to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding compliance with laws and regulations that have a direct effect on the determination of material amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, to perform audit procedures to help identify instances of non-compliance with other laws and regulations that may have a material effect on the financial statements, and to respond appropriately to identified or suspected non-compliance with laws and regulations identified during the audit.

In relation to fraud, the objectives of our audit are to identify and assess the risk of material misstatement of the financial statements due to fraud, to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the assessed risks of material misstatement due to fraud through designing and implementing appropriate responses and to respond appropriately to fraud or suspected fraud identified during the audit.

- discussed matters about non-compliance with laws and regulations and how fraud might occur including assessment of how and where the financial statements may be susceptible to fraud

As a result of these procedures we consider the most significant laws and regulations that have a direct impact on the financial statements are FRS 102, the Companies Act 2006 and tax compliance regulations. We performed audit procedures to detect non-compliances which may have a material impact on the financial statements which included reviewing financial statement disclosures and evaluating advice received from external tax advisors.

The audit engagement team identified the risk of management override of controls as the area where the financial statements were most susceptible to material misstatement due to fraud. Audit procedures performed included but were not limited to testing manual journal entries and other adjustments and evaluating the business rationale in relation to significant, unusual transactions and transactions entered into outside the normal course of business.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year ended 31 March 2022

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

CBPE Holdings Limited is a private company limited by shares incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office of the company is presented on the front page. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102"), the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 as applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime, and under the historical cost convention modified to include certain investments at valuation. The disclosure requirements of section 1A of FRS 102 have been applied other than where additional disclosure is required to show a true and fair view. The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling, rounded to the nearest pound.

The company is exempt from the requirement to prepare group financial statements by virtue of section 400 of the Companies Act 2006. Details of the parent undertaking that draws up the group accounts are included in note 11. These financial statements therefore present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about it as a group.

The headings included within the statement of income and retained earnings, as set out on page 6 of the financial statements, have been adjusted as permitted under the Companies Act 2006. Due to the fact that the company is entitled to a share of the profits of CBPE Capital IX GP LLP and CBPE Capital X GP LLP, the directors are of the opinion that it is more appropriate to use this description rather than turnover.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The directors are satisfied that sufficient resources exist to finance the operations and liabilities of the company for a period of at least 12 months from the date of signing these financial statements and it is well positioned to manage its business risks.

Investments

Unlisted investments are held at fair value through the profit or loss, classified in accordance with FRS 102.11 "Basic Financial Instruments". The realised and unrealised movement in fair value is included as Net gain on investments measured at fair value through profit or loss in the Income Statement.

The unlisted investments represent carried interests receivable from the limited partnerships managed by CBPE Capital LLP, the ultimate parent undertaking of the company. The basis of the valuation of the unlisted investments is estimated carried interest receivable, based on the most recent semi-annual valuations of the individual assets held by each limited partnership. In addition the valuation of the overall portfolio of limited partnership interests reflects the illiquid nature of the portfolio and the effect of the cash distributions, material changes in the business outlook or performance of the individual investments held by each limited partnership subsequent to the last semi-annual valuation.

The semi-annual valuations comply with the International Private Equity and Venture Capital Valuation guidelines (December 2018) endorsed by The British Private Equity and Venture Capital Association.

Valuations of the individual assets held by each limited partnership are typically based on an appropriate multiple of earnings before interest, tax and depreciation ("EBITDA") of each business being valued. If necessary we also adjust the EBITDA, in the last statutory or management accounts as appropriate, to what are considered maintainable levels based on forecast indicators. The multiple of a comparable quoted company, group of companies, sector or recent transactions is used and discounted for differences in size, operations, product mix and liquidity.

Shares in group undertakings are included in the balance sheet at cost less provision for impairment.

Share of profits from partnerships

Share of profits from partnerships represent the member's profit share of CBPE Capital IX GP LLP and CBPE Capital X GP LLP and is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from shares in group undertakings

Income from shares in group undertakings represents dividend income from the company's subsidiaries and is recognised when the dividend is declared by the subsidiary.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (continued) Year ended 31 March 2022

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. The Group utilises group relief therefore taxation amounts may not be settled directly with the tax authorities.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 102.29 "Income Tax".

2. JUDGEMENTS AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

In the application of accounting policies, the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historic experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised where the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods where the revision affects both current and future periods. Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Valuation of unlisted investments

The director's assessment of the carrying value of the unlisted investment is based on a fair value estimation of assets held by limited partnerships managed by CBPE Capital LLP, the ultimate parent undertaking of the company. See note 7 for the estimated carrying value of the carried interest in CBPE Capital Fund VIII. Due to the inherent uncertainties of any valuation technique, actual results could differ from those estimated and such differences could be material, especially under volatile economic conditions. The valuation methodology is detailed in the investments accounting policy.

3. OPERATING PROFIT

The company is entitled to a share of the profits in CBPE Capital IX GP LLP and CBPE Capital X GP LLP which amounted to £nil (2021 - £1).

The audit fee of £4,900 (2021 - £4,600) was met by CBPE Capital LLP, its parent undertaking, in the current and prior year.

4. EMPLOYEES

The total number of employees in the reporting period was nil (2021 - nil). The total number of directors in the reporting period was 5 (2021 - 6). The directors received no remuneration in respect of their services as directors of CBPE Holdings Limited (2021 - £nil).
