#### REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS / TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 31 March 2017 which also meet the requirements for a directors' report and accounts for Companies Act purposes.

The financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006, the Memorandum of Association, and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Citizens Advice Aylesbury Vale was incorporated on 10 September 2008 as a private company, limited by guarantee, and commenced operations on 1 April 2009, when it took over the operations of the previous unincorporated charity. On 8 March 2017 by extraordinary resolution the name was changed from Aylesbury & District Citizens Advice Bureau following the merger with Buckingham Winslow and Disctrict Citizens Advice Bureau. Its company number is 06693405, and it is a registered charity number 1126825. These accounts show the position prior to the merger, which took place on 1 April 2017.

The charitable company was established under a Memorandum of Association which set out the objects and powers, and is governed under its Articles of Association. It is a member of the national association of Citizens Advice Bureaux (Citizens Advice) and is subject to regular quality audits as part of its membership requirements.

The registered company address is 2 Pebble Lane, Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire, HP20 2JH, which is also the principal place of business.

The Trustees who were Members of the Board during the period covered by these accounts were recruited by the advertising of vacancies through a specialist website and through personal contact, and all were interviewed by existing members of the trustee board. New Trustees were informed as to their role through provision of detailed information as to the organisation and they also received formal induction training from Citizens' Advice.

#### PRINCIPLE ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the period under review was the operation of a Citizens Advice Bureau in Pebble Lane, Aylesbury. Citizens advice bureaux give free, independent and confidential advice to members of the public and are in a unique position to be able to campaign for change when social injustices arise.

The Trustees have had regard to the guidance published by the Charity Commissioners on public benefit and believe that the activities of the charity as outlined in the report are for the public benefit.

### REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS / TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

The charity's objectives are to promote any charitable purpose for the benefit of the community in Aylesbury and surrounding areas (the area of benefit) by the advancement of education and preservation of health and the relief of poverty, sickness and distress. Specifically in this charity's case these objects are promoted by the provision of advice and information and (where feasible) action to address social injustices.

#### SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES, ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

The activities of the Charity have, as in previous years, been based on the provision of generalist advice and information, including limited casework and specialist services for the citizens of Aylesbury and the southern part of Aylesbury Vale district.

This year the Board has focused, with success, on securing the future of the organisation through merger with Buckingham, Winslow and District Citizens Advice. This merger will ensure the renewal of the service level agreement with Aylesbury Vale District Council and also free up resources to invest in further business development opportunities reducing our reliance on grant funding and increasing our sustainability. The merger will take place on the 1 April 2017, but much of the preparation work has been delivered in this financial year.

In the year to 31 March 2017 the Bureau has employed up to 7 (2016: 7) full and part time staff and engaged 39 volunteers (2016: 39). Over 3,000 individual clients have been advised or given information on in excess of 5,000 individual issues and there have been over 25,000 contacts in the form of face to face interviews, letters, telephone calls or e-mail exchanges between the bureau and clients or third parties. Demand for our services has consistently outstripped our ability to supply help and advice and the situation is becoming more difficult with many changes to benefits still to come.

During the year the organisation negotiated a new 3 year service level agreement with Aylesbury Vale District Council for its core funding (up to March 2020). It has also received project funding from Bucks County Council for the Accessible Advice project, which was a two year pilot project (ending in March 2017), delivering webchat and email advice channels across Buckinghamshire and information assistance in four libraries across the county.

The Thomas Hickman Charity and the Aylesbury Vale Community Chest provided funding to enable us to employ an Adviceline team leader to significantly increase the number of calls we answer from those clients contacting us by telephone and to support younger people to volunteer with us to improve their employability.

The Big Lottery provided funding for a project run by Buckingham, Winslow and District CAB to deliver financial capability training across Aylesbury Vale.

In addition to seeking funding for specific projects in line with our objectives and to deliver public benefit, fundraising is actively pursued to provide additional funds for the core service.

Staff, Trustees and Friends of Aylesbury & District CAB were active in raising funds through personal donations, money giving websites and promotion of Waitrose in store tokens, which are acknowledged with thanks. Our staff and volunteers also raised £450 through a house to house collection with the Rotary Club's Christmas float in December.

### REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS / TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

The year ending 31 March 2017 saw a small deficit of income against expenditure of £6.1k resulting in a decrease in total reserves (restricted plus unrestricted) to £121.3k. The deficit arose primarily through additional costs associated with the merger with Buckingham, Winslow and District Citizens Advice effective from 1 April 2017. Early in the merger process the Chief Executive of Buckingham, Winslow And District CAB was taken ill for an extended period. It was decided to extend the role of the Aylesbury & District CAB Chief Executive to provide interim cover for Buckingham and this was a major item in expenditure on the merger. Another factor in the deficit for the financial year was expenditure incurred on restricted reserves held at 31 March 2017.

The balance of unrestricted funds at 31 March 2017 was £120,430 (2016: £125,103), of which £120,430 (2016: £125,103) is considered free reserves.

The Trustees have a strategy on reserves which involves holding unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets of between 3 and 6 months of expenditure, resulting in a target range of £43,000 to £85,000 in general funds. The reserves are needed to meet the working capital requirements of the charity and the Trustees are confident that at this level they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. The actual figure at 31 March 2017 of £120,430 is above this range before considering the impact of the merger with Buckingham, Winslow and District Citizens Advice.

Following the merger on 1 April 2017, the unrestricted reserves of the merged charities is £184,546 with budgeted expenditure of between 3 and 6 months of £86,000 and £172,000 respectively demonstrating the need for the level of reserves held.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation and uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

#### Accounting convention

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015 (as updated through Update Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016)) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011 and the Companies Act 2006.

#### Preparation of the accounts on a going concern basis

With the level of reserves held at 31 March 2017 and funding secured from Aylesbury Vale District Council for 2017-18 it is appropriate to prepare the accounts on a going concern basis.

#### Recognition of income and expenditure

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to, and virtually certain to receive, the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy and all performance criteria have been met.

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the activity for which the expenditure was incurred.

#### **Allocation of Support Costs**

Support costs are those functions which support the charity in carrying out its main activities. Accordingly each funded activity has to bear a proportion of these support costs to reflect the full cost of undertaking the work.

#### Pension contributions

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost and written down in full in the year of acquisition.

#### **Debtors**

Debtors and prepayments are recoginised at the settlement amount due or paid.

#### Creditors

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has an obligation which will result in the transfer of funds to a third pary and the amount can be measured or estimated with reasonable accuracy. Deferred income is income received in advance of the associated work being performed.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 March 2017

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### **Financial Instruments**

The charity only has financial assets and liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments and as such are recognised in accordance with the debtor and creditor notes above.

#### **Restricted Funds**

Funding received for a particular project is kept in a restricted fund and spent on salaries and associated costs relating to that project. In addition support costs are allocated as noted above.

#### 2 FUNDS

#### **Aylesbury Vale District Council**

AVDC provide the core funding for the advice service under a two year service level agreement. This continues to be treated as unrestricted this year.

#### Accessible Advice Project - Bucks County Council

This is a two year pilot project (ending in March 2017), delivering webchat and email advice channels across Buckinghamshire and information assistance in four libraries across the county.

## Combatting Worklessness Through Volunteering (CWTV) - Thomas Hickman Charity, Mulberry Trust, Community Chest

During the year grants were awarded by the Thomas Hickman Charity and the Aylesbury Vale Community Chest to Aylesbury CAB for £11,500 and £5,000 for improving our telephone advice and supporting younger people to volunteer with us to improve their employability.

#### Reaching Communities - The Big Lottery

This was a project run by Buckingham, Winslow and District CAB to deliver financial capability training across Aylesbury Vale. We received a payment of £11,500 to cover room hire, utilities and overhead costs for the use of our training room to deliver training sessions.

#### **Unrestricted Funds**

Other material grants and funds received are unrestricted as to purpose and have been used to provide the Core Services as well as to help build reserve levels.

#### 13 OPERATING LEASE

The lease is subject to a 6 month break clause which the company can exercise at any time, therefore the minimum lease commitment is £5,750.

#### 16 POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

The trustees of Aylesbury and Buckingham CABs decided in principle that to merge their activities would be the most suitable way of obtaining funding and providing the core service in future. This has been achieved and the two CABs merged at 1 April 2017. The name of Aylesbury CAB has been changed to Citizens Advice Aylesbury Vale and this will be the continuing charity for the merged activity.

### REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT EXAMINER TO THE TRUSTEES OF CITIZENS ADVICE AYLESBURY VALE

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 March 2017 which are set out on pages five to twelve.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The trustees (who are also the directors of the company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

Having satisfied myself that the charity is not subject to audit under company law and is eligible for independent examination, it is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the 2011 Act;
