DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

The directors present their annual report and the financial statements for the period ended 30 September 2015.

Structure, Governance and Management

Constitution

The company was incorporated on 23 September 2008 and was registered with the Charity Commission on 06 April 2009. The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association under the Companies Acts. The Foundation is a company limited by guarantee.

Trustees

The directors, who are also the trustees of the charity for the purposes of charity law, met regularly during the period to discuss matters of a strategic and administrative nature. The Ambassador Theatre Group Limited (ATG) is entitled to appoint up to 4 directors and has the power to remove and replace any director provided there are no more than 4 ATG directors at any time. The power to appoint the independent directors is vested in the existing directors of the company. The independent directors retire by rotation every 3 years. The maximum number of directors at any time is 8. The directors who served during the period are shown below.

Objectives and Activities for the public benefit

Objectives

The objectives of the charity are:

- to advance the art of theatre, drama and public performance in London and elsewhere,
- to advance the education of the public, including but not limited to, children, young people, the elderly, and people with disabilities or otherwise socially disadvantaged in the art of theatre, drama and public performance in London and elsewhere.

Review of activities

During the period 1 October 2014 to 30 September 2015, The ATG Foundation Board met once, and has funded two major projects. The first of these was the delivery of symbol resources to increase the accessibility of ATG's pantomimes over the 2015/16 period. They commissioned Widget, the UK's leading educational symbol Resource Company to design specific symbols and resources to enable those with learning disabilities to understand, and therefore to better enjoy, a trip to their local venue and the pantomime production. The Foundation also funded the licence agreement to enable the resource to then become fully accessible to all via ATG Tickets website, and it was emailed to all customers who attended a relaxed performance (primarily aimed at those with sensory impairments). This is new area of theatre accessibility that the Foundation is leading on.

Secondly, the ATG Foundation funded the delivery of a targeted project working with secondary schools in the Hackney area. This area has an issue with gangs and postcode hostilities. There are a high proportion of non-English speaking families in the area, and a lack of activity during the Summer break. The aim of the project was to improve relationships and communication between schools and pupils from different schools in the area, using The Bridge Academy as a base. The team worked in schools during the summer term identifying pupils at risk. This core company of young people then worked with theatre professionals brought together by the West End Creative Learning Team over the space of three weeks to deliver a devised piece of theatre ('My Ends, My Rules') based on their experience of identity. The team worked to identify additional opportunities for the young people, such as working with the education team at Westminster Abbey.

The technical, dress and final performances were delivered with the support of ATG staff at the Piccadilly Theatre and were attended by peers, family members and invited guests.

A film and media piece was made and is available to view on YouTube. This project will enter its second phase of delivery in summer 2016.

Public Benefit

The Directors have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the aims and objectives and in planning for future activities. In particular the directors consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims they have set. The directors consider the objectives, as described above, deliver public benefit. Details of the objects which form the basis of this are also given earlier in this report.

Financial Review

The net movement in funds for the period amounted to £57,916 as shown in the statement of financial activities on page 6. The company the directors consider this result to be satisfactory.

Reserves policy

The level of general unrestricted funds at 30 September 2015 was £58,210 (30 September 2014 £294) which is considered adequate for current funding requirements.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities - charitable company

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the period are as follows:-

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005 issued in March 2005) and applicable accounting standards.

1.2 Fund accounting

The unrestricted fund is available for use at the discretion of the Directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

1.3 Incoming resources

All income is accounted for on a receivable basis, other than donations which are recognised when received.

1.4 Resources expended

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis.

Governance costs are costs involved in running the charity as a legal entity.

1.5 Taxation

ATG Foundation registered as a charity with the Charity Commissioners on 6 April 2009. Accordingly, the charity can take advantage of certain tax exemptions in accordance with section 505 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988.
