

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which is dependent upon the continuing support of other companies within the C&C Alpha Group.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced during the year, exclusive of Value Added Tax.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Equipment

- 2-4 year straight line

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.

Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

2. GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the directors believe that the Company's operations will pick up in the foreseeable future which will increase the Company's turnover. In the short term, the Company continues to be reliant on the other companies within the group for its income and as well as for support for cash flow purposes.

The directors of the company are of the opinion that the support of the parent company will continue for at least another 12 month from the date of signing the accounts and that this therefore make it appropriate to prepare the financial statement on a going concern basis.

During the year under review Nira Hospitality Limited charged consultancy fees of £78,738 (2014 - £75,345) to Moti Mahal Delux Limited, £88,625 (2014 - £104,910) to Spa on The Shore Limited, £25,269 (2014 - £14,575) to Shanti Hospitality UK Limited, £65,436 (2014 - £79,743) to Alpine Hospitality (Switzerland) AG a company incorporated in Switzerland.

Included in other debtors at the balance sheet date is £510,773 (2014 - £403,482) due from Moti Mahal Delux Limited, £94,643 (2014 - £64,319) due from Shanti Hospitality UK Limited, all companies are under common control.

Included in creditors amount falling due within one year at the balance sheet date is Nil (2014-£16,152) due to C&C Alpha International Trading a company incorporated in Dubai in which C&C Alpha Group has a significant influence.

Included in profit and loss is an amount of £93,029 (2014 - £75,083) related to Travelling & Entertainment reimbursed to M Puri, he is a director and shareholder of the company, these costs have been incurred in the ordinary courses of business.

Included in Creditors due after one year is an amount of £2,053,490 (2014 - £1,836,904) due to the Company's parent undertaking, Shanti Hospitality Group Limited. Also included in Creditors amounts falling due within one year is an amount of £352,878 (2014-£346,634) due to Mr M Puri director and shareholder of the company.
