Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2010

The Trustees and directors present their report and the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2010. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the charity's constitution, the Charities Act 1993, the Statement of Recommended Practice. Accounting and Reporting by Charities (revised 2005), and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), and have been subjected to an independent examination as required by charity law.

Structure, governance and management

The charity is constituted as a charitable company limited by guarantee, and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 24 July 2008. It is a registered charity from 8 January 2009, and commenced activity on the 1 July 2009, taking over all of the assets, liabilities and activities of the unincorporated charity Bettws Boys and Girls Club [registered charity no 516650]

It is run by a Management Committee which is elected annually at an Annual General Meeting and has powers to co-opt suitable members throughout the year of office. The Management Committee meets regularly with the elected committee members (Trustees), who are appointed at the Annual General Meeting and serve for three years, one third being required to retire at each Annual General Meeting. Retiring trustees may offer themselves for re-election. The Trustees who served during the year are detailed within the Legal and Administrative section.

The club is affiliated to the Clubs for Young People Wales which is in turn affiliated to the National Association of Clubs for Young People. The Management Committee is responsible for all policies, procedures and decisions made. At present the Management Committee employs several full time and part time staff. This staff team is managed under the guidance of the Management Committee by a Club Leader/Projects Manager. The club also relies on the support of many volunteers. There is an induction process for all committee members, volunteers and staff as well as ongoing training opportunities where relevant. All policies and procedures and risk assessments are regularly monitored by the Management Committee.

The charitable company wholly owns Cwest Ltd, a trading subsidiary limited by guarantee No activity had been undertaken through Cwest Ltd at the balance sheet date 31 March 2010

Risk Management

The trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity faces, and have established procedures to mitigate those risks. Financial risks will be managed by seeking to agree funding for both core functions and specific projects for periods longer than twelve months. Operational procedures for project and financial management are regularly examined at trustee meetings. All paid staff and volunteers are subject to CRB checks, and the trustees have policies in place in respect of child protection and vulnerable adults.

Public benefit, objectives and activities

The objects of the charity, as set out in the Memorandum of Articles of Association, are to educate children and young people between the age of 7 and 25, resident in the area of Bettws and surrounding area through their leisure time occupation so as to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society and that their conditions of life may be improved

In setting our objectives and planning our activities the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular to its supplementary public benefit guidance on advancing education

The club is led by its mission statement "To assist in the process of moral, cultural, mental and physical development of young people, to ensure a smooth transition to adult life and responsibilities"

Specific projects in the period included,

- Establishment of Alternative Curriculum provision at the skills factory
- Continuation of funding from Tudor Trust for the Timebank Project and Admin / Finance/ Funding worker
- Local environmental activities and projects
- Sporting activities
- Volunteer project by Deloittes painting pool room and social area
- Residential Weekends outdoor adventure activities
- Timebank project, volunteers cleaning local Church and Church Yard
- Management support for committee with consultancy for Employment Issues organised by Wales Co-op and WAG
- Business Plan for Skills factory provided by Wales Co-op
- Archery workshops organised

Achievements and performance

Club membership has continued at over 460 members. The club has achieved further funding from charitable trusts and donors. The club had continued and developed working partnerships with many organisations. Variety, quality and numbers of activities offered and delivered continued to increase along with increased numbers of staff and volunteers. Particular achievements included,

- Over 200 OCN qualifications registered
- Skills Factory becoming established and working with approximately 20 young people weekly
- Half term Hairdressing and Carpentry courses at Factory for younger children
- Time bank Scheme membership increased
- Timebank Bank reward trips to Alton Towers organised
- Wooden products made at Skills factory sold on site and at Bettws Summer Fun Day
- Establishment of new activities Archery, Dodgeball and Volleyball
- Cheerleading courses again run
- Match Funding for Bunkhouse Accommodation awarded by Big Lottery, process of appointing contractor and construction now underway

The club is once again indebted to the trusts, companies, organisations and individuals who have provided funds during this year - Children in Need, Tudor Trust, Four Acre Trust, BCBC Children and Young Peoples Partnership, Communities First, BCBC, WCVA Communities Investment Fund, WCVA Mental Health, Millennium Stadium Trust, BCBC SMAT, VALREC, Deloittes, Wales & West Housing Association

Financial review

The charity's financial resources decreased by £14,429 in the period, giving total reserves at the period end of £44,537. Of this total, reserves of restricted funds of £30,959 were attributable to specific projects, and a general reserve of £13,578 in unrestricted funds. A summary of the charity's restricted fund projects is set out at Note 13 to the accounts.

Reserves policy

The charity aims to establish appropriate reserves to cover up to six months operating costs plus a contingency for potential redundancies, uninsurable business interruption and legal costs. The reserves may be used for times when funding becomes difficult and to take advantage of new business opportunities. At present achieving reserve levels is not realistic. General unrestricted funds were at a low level and the club is actively seeking further to cover its overhead costs.

Plans for future periods

Further streams of income are being sought in particular to contribute towards the general overheads of the charity, and grants have been approved to further the development of the bunkhouse from The Big Lottery [£388,000] and [CFAP £300,000] It is anticipated that work will commence before the end of November 2010

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 2006

1.2. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are receivable. Grants of a capital nature, given for specific purposes and fully utilised in the furtherance of the objects of the charity, are credited to the relvant fixed asset fund, after those amounts have been properly expended on the specific purpose. The relevant assets are debited to the fixed assets in the accounts at their full cost.

1.3. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity.

Governance costs include costs incurred which are attributable to the management of the charity's assets and compliance with its constitutional and statutory requirements

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010

1.4. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

Land and buildings

Straight line over 50 years

Equipment

20% - 33% straight line

Fixtures and fittings

15% straight line

15. Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

1.6. Funds Structure

In accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, funds are analysed into unrestricted and restricted funds, the latter being fully sub-divided and explained in the notes. Restricted funds are required to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Unrestricted funds comprise the charity's general charitable funds, to be expended in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

1.7. Subsidiary Company

The company wholly owns Cwest Ltd, a trading company limited by guarantee There had been no activity undertaken, nor assets or liabilities held, within Cwest Limited up to 31 March 2010
