Report of the Directors

The Directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2013

1. Principal Activities and business review

In prior year, the Company's principal activity was to act a business centre in Asia for the SSE plc Group, ('the Group') The company appraised opportunities with businesses in the region with a view to investigating potential partnerships, ventures and investments. The Company's operating costs are partly recharged to the principal businesses in the Group that are being supported by its activities. The company ceased trading in Asia on 31 March 2012, although it still occurs certain administrative expenses.

2 Results and Dividends

The Company made a loss of £104,000 in the period to 31 March 2013 (loss of £62,000 in 2012) The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2012 - £nil)

As the directors do not intend to acquire a replacement trade the financial statements have not been prepared on a going concern basis. The effect of this is explained in Note 1

3 Share Capital

The Company's authorised ordinary share capital is £1,000 divided into 1,000 shares of £1 00 each. The entire issued share capital is held by SSE Venture Capital Limited (a fellow group undertaking)

Notes on the Financial statements for the period ended 31 March 2013

1. Significant accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The principal accounting policies are summarised below and have been applied consistently

In previous years, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. However on 31 March 2012 the directors took the decision to cease trading. As they do not intend to acquire a replacement trade, the directors have not prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis. No adjustments were necessary to the amounts at which the remaining net assets are included in these financial statements.

The financial statements report a loss for the year of £104,000 (2012 - £62,000 loss) and net liabilities of £372,000 (2012 - £268,000), which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reasons. The company is dependent for its working capital on funds provided to it by SSE plc, the company's ultimate parent company. SSE plc has indicated that for at least 12 months, and for the foreseeable future, from the date of approval of these financial statements, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the company and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. The directors consider that this should enable the company to continue in existence for the foreseeable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment

Under Financial Reporting Standard 1 (FRS 1), the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that the ultimate parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated Financial statements

As the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of SSE plc, it has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the SSE plc Group (the Group)

Turnover

Turnover comprises the value of goods, services and facilities provided during the year

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the loss for the year

Current tax, including UK corporation tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted, or substantially enacted, by the balance sheet date
