PART 1

The company has continued its engagement with "hard-to-reach" learners at its centres in Market Rasen, Gainsborough and Mablethorpe. The two main activities have involved the Foundation Learning Programmefor 16-18 years olds who are "NEET" (to which we recruited 90 learners across the 3 centres) and the Community Learning programmes for adults aged 19+ which involved delivering a wide variety on non-accredited short courses across East/West Lindsey and Lincoln. We continued to develop the Apprenticeship programme, offering frameworks in business administration, customer care, health and social care and management - focussing on the local areas in which we operate

In addition, this year the company has looked to extend its activities to supporting people with mental health problems, providing educational and social support for those people classified as "recovering mentally ill". In pursuance of this, we have held open events on World Mental Health Day, provided a series of one-day workshops on a variety of mental disorders and offered healthy eating advice.

As part of our social remit, we have organised a number of Macmillan Coffee Mornings, Early Prevention of Cancer (EPOC) Days and been involved in increasing the number of volunteers within the East and West Lindsey districts of Lincolnshire

This year involved some financial challenges as we were required to accommodate a significant clawback of funds due to low recruitment of young people onto the Foundation Learning programme in the previous year. This required some hard decisions about staffing levels and the breadth of services we offer. However recruitment in the 2011-2012 year was eventually healthy due to the hard work of staff. A refreshed strategy and business development plan was introduced in early July with the intention of re-establishing CGP as a key and healthy player in community learning in Lincolnshire.

Our Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) met twice in the year. One function was to review the progress of the key programmes and internal and external influences on their delivery. For example, some discussion took place on the implications of the Raising of the Participation. Age. The SAG also approved the Self-Assessment Report. SAG members also brought their own expertise and critical input to the meetings which enables CGP managers to think creatively about strategic issues.

CG Partnership also consults with learners and the community throughout the year using both formal feedback and informal methods. For example, this year some Learner Forums were held whereby local people discussed and fedback on their needs and interests for Adult Community Learning.
