#### Principal accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in both the current and preceding years in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements. These financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, including The Financial Reporting Standard ('FRS 102'), Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP).

The financial statements are presented in Pounds Sterling (£) because that is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the company operates.

#### Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, which assumes that the company will continue to be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due for the foreseeable future.

The directors consider the going concern basis to be appropriate having taken into consideration that its liabilities, which are to fellow group companies, are not required to be settled if the company does not have the ability to do so.

#### **Cash flow statement**

The company, being a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking where 100% of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, paragraph 1.12(b).

#### Administrative exceptional items

The company classifies certain one-off charges or credits that have a material impact on the company's results as 'exceptional items'. These are disclosed separately to provide further understanding of the financial performance of the company.

#### Income from investment in joint venture

The company holds a 100% interest in the capital of a Limited Liability Partnership registered in the United Kingdom. Under the terms of the Limited Liability Partnership agreement, profits of the LLP are distributed to members upon approval of such a distribution by the Members. Income from the company's investment in its joint venture is recognised when the Members of the LLP formally approve a distribution.

#### Fixed asset investments

Investments are stated at cost less any provision for impairment.

#### Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation

In the application of the Company's accounting policies the directors are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions about the carrying amount of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and other factors that are considered to be relevant. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the year in which the estimate is revised and / or future year as applicable. During the year there were no critical accounting judgements or estimates made.

#### 1 Administrative exceptional income

During the previous year a debt waiver was signed in respect of a balance owed to the company's parent. The administrative exceptional credit of £3,900,000 represents the value of this intercompany balance.
