TGV CiC was created as a response to The Big Green Challenge,(BGC) a community centred carbon reduction challenge prize offered by the National Endowment for Science, Technology and the Arts (NESTA). The aim of the CiC throughout this year was put together a winning project to receive part of the £1million prize fund by developing and demonstrating community based carbon reduction initiatives. The work throughout the year April 09-Jan 10 is summarized in Attachment 1 TGVs BGC Year as is the feedback from the NESTA Judging panel. TGV were one of three joint winners of the Big Green Challenge.

Community benefits generated through the Big Green Challenge year are
Enabling and supporting the creation of local community Energy Groups
Enabling and supporting the creation of community woodland management groups
Coordinating carbon audits for community members (a key indicator of the Big Green Challenge)
Developing financial models for enabling community owned hydro-electric generators
Assessment of hydro-electric generation potential within communities
Development of a community owned hydro turbine, to permission stage

After confirmation as joint winners of the BGC, TGV reviewed the achievements over the previous year and began to develop business plans and make decisions on how best to use the positive publicity and prize fund to develop and further the aims of the ICIC.

The company's stakeholders are the communities of the Brecon Beacons National Park and surrounding area, though more specifically it is those individuals and groups that have become members of TGV. It was extensive consultation with local communities and groups that resulted in the formation of TGV as a Community Interest Company as an appropriate mechanism with which to pursue the BGC prize fund Following the announcement of TGV as joint winners of the BGC, TGV held an open event in March 2010 at The George Hotel, Brecon to celebrate the achievement, to recognise the contributions of communities and local groups and to outline how TGV aims to develop over the coming years. As TGV has very broad objectives, consultation has been extensive and wide ranging with many ideas and opportunities being considered. In response to these consultations, TGV has decided to pursue the development of hydro-electric schemes as these offer significant local carbon savings and the income generation potential to fund future initiatives.
