Review of Activities

The charity has had a very good year with income of £16,141 in the year (last year £13,290)

Numerous events were held in the year, in particular

- 1) **Gujarati Church Service:** GCFUK successfully organised the Gujarati Church Service on every second (Wembley) & fourth Sunday (Hounslow) of each month in London to worship in Gujarati language
- 2) **Holy Week meeting:** GCFUK organised special meetings during Holy week in April for the spiritual benefit of the members
- 3) Easter Celebration: Easter was celebrated in April at Northwood Methodist Church which included Gujarati folk dance and Easter Dinner for the members
- 4) Christmas Carols & Celebration: Christmas Carols were organised in different areas in London during December Christmas Celebration was successfully organised by GCFUK where around 180 members attended the event
- 5) **GCFUK Picnic:** A successful picnic was organised by GCFUK on 17 July 2010 at South-end-on sea 72 members enjoyed this day long outing
- 6) GCFUK Family Seminar A special seminar for married couples was organised by GCFUK on 29 August 2010 at the Northwood Methodist Church Around 14 couples participated and benefitted from this event
- 7) **GCFUK Anniversary:** The Gujarati Christian Fellowship celebrated its third annual anniversary on 24 October 2010 at the Northwood Methodist Church in West London where members thanked God for His faithfulness and the cultural diversity that they themselves enjoy in the UK
- 8) Day of Prayer for Japan: On 18th March 2011, GCFUK organised a day long prayer chain for the people of Japan that was struck by devastated earthquake and Tsunami. Around 25 people joint in this special prayers
