Review of Activities

The charity has had a very good year with income of £21,532 in the year (last year £14,843)

Numerous events were held in the year, in particular

- 1) Gujarati Worship, Prayer and Church support: The GCFUK has organised the worship, prayer, Gujarati Church Service in Gujarati language on every second and fourth Sunday of each month for the moral, spiritual benefit, to strengthen their faith and to provide support to the members. To provide proper and more peaceful environment during the worship, prayer and Church service the GCFUK has hired the St John, The Evangelist Church Wembley for every 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month
- 2) Revival Meeting 2012 2013: The GCFUK organised special meetings at St John, The Evangelist Church Wembley during Holy week from 1st April to 7th April 2012 and from 24th March 2013 to 30th March 2013 to provide moral, physical, spiritual benefit and to strengthen faith of the members The GCFUK has invited Professor Ravikant Kant from India to provide teaching and training to the members during the Revival meeting in 2012 and Pastor and teacher Immanual Christian provide teaching and training during 2013 Revival meeting
- 3) Easter Celebration: The Easter was celebrated on 8th April 2012 and 31st March 2013 at St John, The Evangelist Church Wembley. The members actively participated in different activities, worship service, Church service, teaching and Gujarati folk dance (Garba) and fellowship dinner
- 4) GCFUK Picnic: The GCFUK has successfully organised picnic on 4th August 2012 at Ramsgate, Kent to promote unity in community 64 members participated in the picnic and enjoyed a day long break at the beautiful beach
- 5) Sports Day: To celebrate the spirit of Olympic the GCFUK organised the Sports Day on 19th August 2012 at Barham Park, Sudbury area and members participated in the different games, activities and enjoyed the fellowship and refreshments
- 6) Children Activities: The GCFUK is providing support to children through Sunday school twice a month and also organised Children Sunday to educate and to develop the skills of children More than 16 children took part in different activities and perform individual and group performances
- 7) Cultural and community events during Christmas: The GCFUK has organised the cultural activities on 15th December at the Sudbury Methodist Church to celebrate and spreading the message of peace in community, around 150 members

participate the event The event was comprised of individual and group performances, singing of carols, children programme and activities, fellowship dinner and Gujarati folk dance (Garba) The GCFUK also organised the Christmas Carol's Service on 23rd December 2012, Christmas Day Church Service on 25th December 2012, Thanksgiving on 31st December 2012 and New Year Day Church Service on 1st January 2013 at the different venues for the benefit of the community

- 8) Training for members: To provide extra support to the members, the GCFUK has organised a one day retreat and training program for the members on 9th September 2012 at The Church of Annunciation, Harrow Approximately 45 people participated in the event Different activities to encourage and to help the members was organised, practical training was given and fellowship lunch was also organised
- 9) Women's Activities: The GCFUK is supporting the work among the women in community to strengthen them spiritually and to address their social needs. The Women Fellowship provides telephonic prayer & support services to the community. They also visit the sick in the hospital and provide different kind of support to those in need. The GCFUK has celebrated the Mother's Sunday on 10th March 2013 at St. John, The Evangelist Church Wembley, more than 40 women participated in the event and took part in the different activities and honour the mothers with flowers. The whole event was organised and led by the women
- 10) Overseas Development Support Fund: To fulfil its object the GCFUK has always committed to help and support the sick and poor people and as per the policy of the Trust, the GCUK has supported the literacy and HIV/AIDS care projects in state of Gujarat, India. The partner organisation utilised the fund to buy the medicines and to provide educational support to the children of HIV/AIDS affected families. This year GCGUK also provide financial support to a young girl Ms. Shilpa Parmar, in India to achieve her dream to complete her nursing study.



Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over expected useful life as follows


