### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### **Board of Trustees**

The members of the Board of Trustees who served during the year 2015 are listed on page 1 of the financial statements. Trustees are appointed and removed by the Board of Trustees. Potential new trustees are periodically identified by the Board of Trustees. These individuals work alongside existing trustees for a period of time before considering their appointment. No new trustees were appointed during the year.

#### Operation

The Charity is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. There is one full time director to manage day-to-day administration of the Charity and is in regular contact with the other trustees. There are number of full and part time volunteers and employees.

#### Risk management

The trustees actively review the major risks which the Charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining cash reserves of at least £1 million, equivalent to one year's expenditure for the Charity, combined with our annual review of the controls over key financial systems will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees have also assessed other operational and business risks which they face and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

### Objectives and aims

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and is governed by the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

2015 has shown to be a very progressive and dynamic year for ISKCON-London Ltd across all areas of improvement in terms of quality and quantity.

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

ISKCON-London is guided by the seven purposes that our Founder-Acarya HDG AC Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada established 50 years ago when ISKCON was inaugurated. The purposes stand as our objectives for the charity.

Those purposes are as follows:

- 1. To systematically propagate spiritual knowledge to society at large and to educate all people in the techniques of spiritual life in order to check the imbalance of values in life and to achieve real unity and peace in the world.
- 2. To propagate a consciousness of Krishna (God), as it is revealed in the great scriptures of India, Bhagavad-gita and Srimad-Bhagavatam.
- 3. To bring the members of the Society together with each other and nearer to Krishna, the prime entity, thus developing the idea within the members, and humanity at large, that each soul is part and parcel of the quality of Godhead (Krishna).
- 4. To teach and encourage the sankirtana movement, congregational chanting of the holy name of God, as revealed in the teachings of Lord Sri Caitanya Mahaprabhu.
- 5. To erect for the members and for society at large a holy place of transcendental pastimes dedicated to the personality of Krishna.
- 6. To bring the members closer together for the purpose of teaching a simpler, more natural way of life.
- 7. With a view towards achieving the aforementioned purposes, to publish and distribute periodicals, magazines, books and other writings.

In order to achieve the above objectives we use the following strategies:

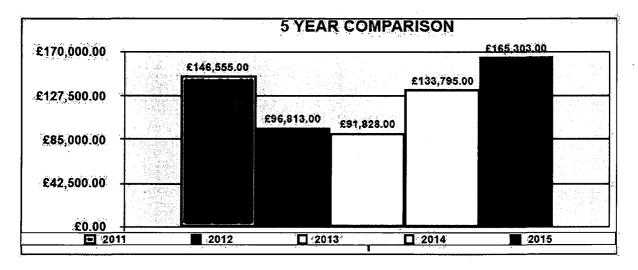
- Publication and distribution of literature
- Promotion through other media
- Public services, festivals, retreats and pilgrimages which promote spiritual culture
- The distribution and promotion of sanctified vegetarian food (prasadam)
- Education in doctrines, training in religious practice: pastoral care
- Encouraging positive life principles and social engagement through volunteering
- The opening of new centres / sangas (spiritual gatherings)
- Youth outreach
- Fundraising
- Kirtan (congregational chanting of the names of the Supreme Being)

The following shows results for each strategy:

### **Literature Distribution**

We increased not only the number of books distributed (show below by amount of money earned) but also the volunteer community involvement (253+ persons). We also introduced follow-up programmes in towns where we distribute books, invested in more training for participants as well as equipment and clothing for those distributing.

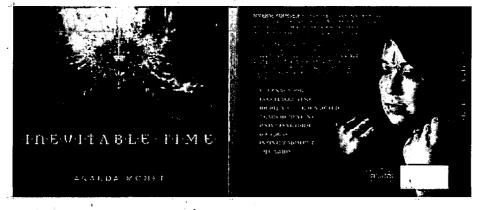


As you can see there was a £31,508 increase in 2015 over 2014. We are focusing continued efforts in this area for 2016.

### **Promotion Through Other Media**

Our Radha Krishna Records music label, started 6 years ago, released two new albums which engaged the talents of many youth and volunteers. These albums were also launched across internet channels such as iTunes and even won an award. RK Records sold over 1000 albums in 2016 and introduced an annual kirtan/cultural event which showcased music, dance, video & philosophy. We sold about 400 tickets and 40% of attendees had never been to a kirtan event before.

Plans for 2016 - Improved cultural event and launch of an on-line YouTube channel.

### **Public Festivals, Retreats and Pilgrimages**

We hold the biggest annual Ratha Yatra festival outside of India every year where we feed in excess of 20,000 people, share the culture and chant the holy names in kirtana encouraging a peaceful more spiritual way of life.



We also hold 15 large festivals annually which attracts many members of the public and includes the feeding of a minimum of 350 people, chanting and culture.

In 2015, we had a Mentorship retreat to Norfolk for 4 days which enriched the lives of our serious practitioners. It was attended by about 50 persons and a senior, special guest speaker who trained everyone in spiritual science and practice.



We plan continued investment in these outreach areas for 2016.

### The Distribution of Sanctified Vegetarian Food (Prasadam)

Our Govinda's Restuarant served on average 500 customers per day, as well as providing prasadam for several University programmes, catering for many spiritual, professional events and weddings. Sales for 2015 were £664,000 up only about £3,000 from 2014 but profits were increased by approximately £60,000.

Plans to refurbish Govinda's in 2016 with the reserve fund held for last few years and look to improve staff retention, training and customer care.

Our Food for Life programme of feeding the homeless and underprivileged continued in 2015. Run wholly by a team of about 20+ volunteers and feeding at least 600 people per week.

We have plans for 2016 to provide more support to the team with regular gatherings and to introduce one more evening of distribution bringing the total to five - Monday-Friday each week.

### **Education & Training**

Our education department affiliated with the Bhaktivedanta Manor College of Vedic Studies to become the London College of Vedic Studies and ran over 30 courses and seminars bringing in over £5000 and servicing well over 1000 members of the community and public with a variety of training courses in spiritual arts, philosophy and technics.

Plans for 2016 - We will hand over the department to a new person and aim to improve the quality and quantity of courses offered next year.

### Encouraging positive life principles and social engagement through volunteering

Our charity is predominately run by volunteers and at least a core of 300-350 volunteers are required weekly to make things happen at ISKCONLondon.

Our satellite centre in Rochester – Closet Krishna also works with local government to engage many unemployed and troubled youth in our charity shop.



We have a dedicated team who looks after our volunteers and we are always trying to engage more and more.

Volunteers provide services from deity worship, distributing spiritual literature, cleaning, decorating, running festivals, events and group gatherings, mentoring members, helping with mail outs, administration etc.

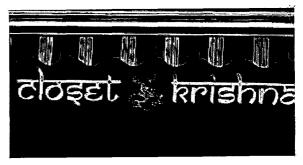
The total number of hours provided by volunteers is in the region of 350 to 400 hours a week.

### The opening of new centres / sangas (spiritual gatherings)

In mid-2014 we opened ISKCON Closet Krishna in Rochester and it has moved from strength to strength in offering so much spiritual guidance and assistance to the local community and greater Kent area. They ran seminars and courses, engaged in interfaith, worked with volunteers from local government placement schemes and raised £71,000.





Also ISKCON-Crawley Bhakti Yoga Centre which was opened in 2013 has continued to offer service to the local community. They hold regular weekly classes, distribute prasadam, have retreats, regional events, literature distribution and youth gatherings.



Plans for 2016 - to try and purchase the ISKCON-Crawley property, to launch the Closet Krishna online and also try to open another shop in the Kent area with a new team.

### Fundraising & Financial Information

Our center is not in financial deficit. In fact we are doing well financially. In 2015 we did not do any specific fundraising for any projects over and above our normal activities.

Our main areas for fundraising are:

Govinda's Restaurant
Community Development
Literature Distribution
Festivals and Deity Department

We hold the following reserves and restricted funds:-

Property Fund £480,000 - created in 2014 for buy to let property investments. These investments were delayed and will be made in 2016.

New Temple Reserves (restricted fund) £108,738 – This project has been on-going for some time and will cost several million to complete.

Restaurant Refurbishment Reserves £27,000 - We intend to spend this fund in refurbishing the Restaurant in 2016.

Benevolent Fund £20,000 – The fund will be used in case of emergency requirement in regard to the monks living in our charity's temple.

Deity Department Reserves £11,000 – We intend to carry out some refurbishments in our Deities Department and will be using this fund in 2016.

Nitya Seva Reserves - £4000. This amount is kept in the high interest account and the interest goes to pay for the worship of the deity on a particular day chosen by the donor. The capital amount remains intact.

We have no separate or specific investments apart from £1.1 million in a high interest account with CAF Bank Ltd.

We hold "NO" assets on behalf of other individuals and are not affiliated with any other charities. Although as mentioned above we act as a foster parent charity for ISKCON Rochester and Crawley.

Neither our centre nor our trustees hold or act as custodian trustees of other organisations, though our Temple President and Chairman Mr. James Edwards is also the Chairman for the Sri Sri Radha-Krishna Cultural Centre Trust (ISKCON-South London) — in a managerial capacity.

We are very much dependent on donations in kind and about 10% of the Deity Department requirements are made up of donations in kind and 40% of the prasadam distribution project receives donations in kind.

Thus at least 25% of our charity's requirements in terms of fruits and vegetables, milk and grain flour and paraphernalia required for worship are donated by our congregation in kind. In monetary terms it would be worth £250,000.

### **Funding Other Projects:**

In 2015 we were able to assist a few other projects who share the same objectives and strategies but are in less favourable circumstances.

**ISKCON-Leicester** - Recently purchased a large property requiring a lot of maintenance and refurbishment. We made a contribution to them of £3,800.

International Deity Worship Ministry - require on-going funding as this Global Ministry operates on a very small budget and our Head Priest is a regional representative to this Ministry. We donated £1,200.

**ISKCON-Amsterdam** - were in a desperate situation with losing their property and needing a downpayment for a new property. We contributed £12,000.

**ISKCON-Lithuania (Harinama Mandir)** - are constructing a monastary for their travelling monks who regularly visit London and assist with our street chanting and other charitable activities. They requested a donation and we gave £5,000.

### Kirtan (Congregational Chanting of the Names of the Supreme Being)

This activity is one of our primary activities and accompanies all our activities. It is thus already mentioned several times elsewhere in this report.



#### The Future:

2016 is our ISKCON's 50th Anniversary year and we have plans for a number of special events and gestures of appreciation and recognition of this great milestone, such as:

### • Complete Refurbishment

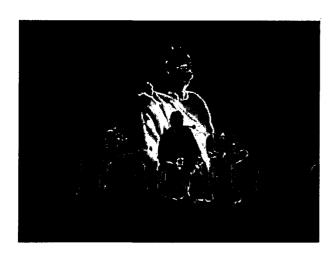
• To spend in the region of £250,000 in order to completely update, repair and refurbish the entire property.

- Develop a Committed Leadership Team:
  - To establish a broader more focused team to take our project to the next level.
- Develop a Community Care Team:
  - To create a focused team that addresses the needs and concerns of our growing community on all levels, spiritual, physical, emotional and intellectual.
- Hold at least 3 Hallmark events in honour of the 50th Anniversary
  - Huge Kirtan (Chanting) Boat Party down the Thames as a thank you to all our Patron Donors and to showcase the amazing talent we have in the kirtana yoga field.
  - An external 47th Anniversary Festival themed for the 50th Anniversary inviting dignitaries, multifaith and yoga institutions in order to raise awareness of our activities and achievements.
  - Ratha Yatra Festival to be 50th themed and celebrating the glories of our achievements.
- Many goals have been mentioned in the report previously, such as increasing literature distribution, mentorship retreat and opening a new centre in Kent.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

# REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITORS TO THE MEMBERS OF INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY FOR KRISHNA CONSCIOUSNESS LONDON

We have audited the financial statements of International Society for Krishna Consciousness London for the year ended 31 December 2015 on pages eight to sixteen. ### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes including the charity's shop.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities.

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and costs related to statutory requirements.

### Allocation and apportionment of costs

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Long leasehold

- Over the period of the lease

Plant and machinery

- 20% on cost

Motor vehicles

- 25% reducing balance

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### 17. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

During the year International Society for Krishna Consciousness London paid £14,206 (2014 - £5,371) as affiliation and other fees to International Society for Krishna Consciousness Limited (ISKCON Ltd). International Society for Krishna Consciousness London and ISKCON Ltd are related by virtue of having a common trustee.

During the year International Society for Krishna Consciousness London purchased books from ISKCON Ltd amounting to £88,246 (2014 - £77,151).

During the year the company purchased dairy products amounting to £281 (2014: £6,939) from ISKCON Goshalla Limited. Included in trade creditors is amount of £Nil (2014: £1,113) owed to ISKCON Goshalla Limited. ISKCON Goshalla Limited is 100% subsidiary of International Society for Krishna Consciousness Limited.

#### 18. COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE

International Society for Krishna Consciousness London is a company limited by guarantee and accordingly does not have a share capital.

Every member of the company undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charitable company in the event of its being wound up while he or she is a member, or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member.
