The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 September 2014.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the trust's deed of trust, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

#### Structure, governance and management

The trust is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

#### Recruitment and appointment of trustees:

Under the requirements of the Articles of Association, trustees are elected for a period of three years after which they must be re-elected at the next Annual General Meeting. Trustees annually review the period of service.

The board of trustees regularly discusses the recruitment of new trustees for their experience, empathy and knowledge of the charity, and to keep the skills and composition of the trustee body as a whole and succession planning under review.

All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefits from the charity. Any expenses reclaimed by the trustees from the charity are set out in note 9 to the financial statements.

#### Organisational structure:

The charity is administered by a board of directors who are also trustees. The day to day running of the charity is overseen by Mr David Boocock, Centre Manager, who reports to the trustees.

The trustees met for business meetings in December, March, May, July and September.

#### Risk management:

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the trust is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

#### Objectives and activities

The trust's objects are to further or benefit the residents of Exeter and in particular the neighbourhood of St. David's without distinction of gender, sexual orientation, race or of political, religious or other opinions by associating together the said residents and the local authorities, voluntary and other organisations in a common effort to advance education and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation leisure time occupation with the objective of improving the conditions of life for the residents.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the trust should undertake.

The activity of the charity is that of the running and maintenance of the Exeter Centre at 17 St. David's Hill, Exeter in furtherance of its objectives as detailed above.

#### Achievements and performance

The Centre had been reopened for 18 months at the start of this financial year, and bookings were beginning to hit their stride. The bookings management system which had been specially commissioned for the Centre has all this year been giving trustees both accurate day to day information on bookings and also room booking performance data upon which to plan future use of space. We developed this year a waiting list for tenancies of the Centre and decided, after discussion and risk assessment, to re-develop the top floor of the west wing of the Centre as additional office space for tenancy. The Centre is now fully tenanted as per our business plan — one third of the Centre tenanted and two thirds as sessional space. The sessional space has performed above hiring, social and financial targets, with hirers remarking on the buzz in the Centre, its friendly welcome and efficient service.

The Community Garden – now called the Mulberry Garden for its mulberry tree – has been completed, with an opening ceremony for a Storytelling Bench made from local oak in the Garden. The opening ceremony was conducted by the award winning author of 'War Horse', Michael Morpurgo, whose charity 'Farms for City Children' is based in the Centre. Both Michael and local primary school children told stories from the bench and the sun shone. The catering for this event, as for the Centre generally, was provided by the Mulberry Café, which has attracted customers from visitors to Centre, local residents and passers by. It has been heartening to see people drinking coffee and tea in the community garden after all the hard work of the volunteers this year in planting flowers and herbs and weeding to keep the Garden attractive.

The Trust hosted a project this year, funded by The People's Health Trust, which we called 'Past Present Future'. Volunteers collected the memories of the Centre and St David's neighbourhood from local residents and these were used to bring the diverse groups of residents and Centre users together through workshops and an exhibition of the collected memories and artworks commissioned. These will be kept in the Centre as a permanent record. Of particular note was the coming together in a workshop and afternoon tea event of former residents of the Centre when it was a residential school for the blind. Former residents in the 1950s and 1960s came together to be shown round the Centre and marvel at what had changed – and what had stayed the same from their time living here.

As always, the most valued resource of the Centre has been its staff and volunteers. Our staff have continued to give 100% commitment and their enthusiasm has also attracted a number of volunteers to help on reception and in the Mulberry Garden. Our long term volunteers have also been joined by those coming to us for work experience to hone their skills for the world of employment.

And of course a major achievement has been the continuing commitment of our board of trustees, those skilled and experienced local residents who give their time and effort so freely and who are the engine and driver for our Centre.

#### Financial review

During the period the charity received £182,029 from charitable activities (2013: £199,243), and £19,703 other income (2013: 7,366). Resources expended totalled £205,874 (2013: 187,630).

In 2013 grants accounted for £106k of the £199k income received, however in 2014 grants only accounted for £34k of the £182k received from charitable activities whilst income from leases, sessional hire and catering increased by almost 60%, year on year. In order to grow this income it will be necessary to develop the top floor to provide more income generating accommodation in the future.

Resources expended increased by some £18k in 2014 necessary, in part, to service the increased level of use of the facilities and to continue to maintain the fabric of the building to a good standard.

The staff and trustees are grateful to Social Investment Business for the continuing support provided to the Centre and also thank all other donors and supporters for their contributions both financial and in kind.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2014

It is the policy of the trust that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the trust's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

#### Plans for the future

The charity plans to continue the activities outlined above in the forthcoming years. In particular to remain the centre for the local community where individuals and groups can make the most of the wide variety of spaces and activities offered.

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are recognised once the charity has entitlement to the resources, it is certain that the resources will be received and the monetary value of incoming resources can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Income from donations and grants, including capital grants, is included in incoming resources when these are receivable, except as follows:

- when donors specify that donations and grants given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods; and
- when donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income:

the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.

#### Interest receivable:

Interest receivable is included in investment income when it is receivable by the charitable company.

Intangible income, comprising donated services, is included in incoming resources at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised when there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

#### 1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Other loans are amounts borrowed from the Social Investment Business (Community Builders Fund) for the refurbishment of the Centre. The loan is secured by way of a fixed charge over the property held by the charity. The loan has an interest rate of 5% per annum for three years following the drawdown at which point it will be reviewed by the lender. The loan is repayable in 10 years from the date of the loan with interest only payments being due until 24 months after the day of first draw down at which point it will revert to being capital and interest.

#### 15 Share capital

The company is limited by guarantee, having no share capital. Every member of the Company undertakes to contribute up to £1 to the assets of the Company in the event that it is wound up while being a member, or within one year after ceasing to be a member, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Company contracted before ceasing to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustments of the rights of the contributors among themselves.

On 23 June 2014 the Social Investment Business (SIB) agreed to provide further capital and revenue grants of £34,200 along with further loans of £136,800 in order to complete the building works including dry rot treatment, reinstatement of the 3rd floor and to provide further working capital funds.

SIB funds are for the refurbishment of the Centre and working capital.

Devon County Council funds are for refurbishment of the Centre and Community Garden.

PHT funds are for 'Past Present Future' community development project.
