The Trustees (who are also Directors for the purpose of common law) present their report and financial statements of the company for period ended 30th September 2010. The provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP) issued in 2005 have been adopted in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

Manchester Youth Zone (Harpurhey) is a company limited by guarantee without share capital and registered under the Companies Act 1985, registration number 07025561 The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, dated 27th August 2009 Management of the company's affairs is vested in the co-directors

In the event of a winding-up, the present members and those who have ceased to be a member within one year of such an event have guaranteed the liabilities of the company to the sum not exceeding one pound each

Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees

New trustees will be recruited according to the needs of the charity and the suitability of possible candidates A unanimous approval of existing Trustees would lead to their appointment

The Memorandum and Articles of Association states that the number of members shall have no maximum and shall not be less than three

Full details of the rules are contained in the company's Memorandum and Articles of Association, dated on the incorporation of 22nd September 2009, which may be inspected at the registered office

Induction of Trustees

Newly appointed trustees are provided with a comprehensive induction to Manchester Youth Zone (Harpurhey) through the provision of in-house training

Organisational Structure

Manchester Youth Zone (Harpurhey) is governed by its Trustee board which is responsible for setting the strategic direction of the organisation and the policy of the charity. The Trustees carry the ultimate responsibility for the conduct of Manchester Youth Zone (Harpurhey) and for ensuring that the charity satisfies its legal and contractual obligations. The Trustees meet on a monthly basis

Risk Management

The Trustees have considered the major risks to which the charity is exposed and have established suitable risk management and control procedures

Objectives and Activities

The charity's objects are to help and educate children in the North West of England through their leisure time activities by promoting their full physical and spiritual potential in order that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of society and that their conditions of life may improve

Principal activities

Manchester Youth Zone (Harpurhey) was established to provide a high quality facility where young people will have a place where they can go, be safe, meet friends, get active, feel at home, learn new skills, enjoy themselves and be inspired.

Public Benefit

The activities of the charity were undertaken to further its charitable purposes for public benefit. The provision of a high quality facility for young people responds to a clear, ongoing demand from young people, parents and the wider community for more and better places for young people to go. The facility will focus on attendance and participation by young members of disadvantaged communities who will be able to enjoy accessible and affordable access to all the opportunities that the facility will provide. This will lead to improved achievements and enhanced aspirations amongst young members of the local community. The will be happier, healthier and making more constructive use of their leisure time, which will help reduce nuisance and anti-social behaviour. Longer term public benefits will include improved health, reduced crime, enhanced learning and employability and greater community cohesion.

The Trustees have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission

Reserves policy

The board of Trustees of Manchester Youth Zone (Harpurhey) has established a reserves policy, in compliance with which it will annually review both the sum it wishes to hold in reserve in the unrestricted budget and the basis for that figure. The Trustees continually strive to manage the charity's finances so that an adequate level of reserves can be maintained in compliance with the reserves policy.

Trustees' Responsibilities

The charity's Trustees are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

Company law requires the charity's Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year that give a true and fair view of the state of the charity's incoming resources and applications of resources during the period and of its state of affairs at the end of the year. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume the charity will continue in operation
