1 Accounting convention

2 Profit and loss account

3 Statement of cash flows

The financial statements do not include a statement of cash flows because the Company, as small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under Section 7 of FRS 102.

4 Related party transactions

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption within Section 33 of FRS 102 (Related party disclosures) in not disclosing transactions with other wholly owned entities in the Saga group of companies.

5 Ultimate parent undertaking

The immediate parent undertaking at 31 January 2016 is Titan Travel Holdings Limited, a company which is registered in England and Wales. The Company is wholly owned by Titan Travel Holdings Limited.

The financial statements of the Company have been consolidated in the group financial statements of Acromas Holidays Limited (an intermediate parent undertaking), and Saga plc (the ultimate parent undertaking), all of which are registered in England and Wales.

In respect of the year ending 31 January 2016, Acromas Holidays Limited is the parent company of the smallest group of which the Company is a member and for which group financial statements are prepared.
