Report of the Directors for the Year Ended 31 July 2019

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 July 2019.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of a holding company of Tracsis Retail & Operations Limited (previously Datasys Limited), a company providing software for the rail industry. The company did not trade in the current or preceding period.

DIVIDENDS

An interim dividend of £3,218.88 per share was paid on 26 April 2019 (2018: interim dividends paid per share of £1,502.15 on 16 February 2018, and £2,145.92 on 27 April 2018). The directors recommend that no final dividend be paid (2018: £nil).

The total distribution of dividends for the year ended 31 July 2019 will be £750,000 (2018: £850,000).

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF DATASYS INTEGRATION LIMITED

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Datasys Integration Limited ("the company") for the year ended 31 July 2019 which comprise the Income Statement, Statement of Other Comprehensive Income, the Balance Sheet, and the Statement of Changes in Equity, and related notes, including the accounting policies in note 2.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 July 2019 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with UK accounting standards, including FRS 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) ("ISAs (UK)") and applicable law. Our responsibilities are described below. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities under, and are independent of the company in accordance with, UK ethical requirements including the FRC Ethical Standard. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is a sufficient and appropriate basis for our opinion.

Going concern

The directors have prepared the financial statements on the going concern basis as they do not intend to liquidate the company or to cease its operations, and as they have concluded that the company's financial position means that this is realistic. They have also concluded that there are no material uncertainties that could have cast significant doubt over its ability to continue as a going concern for at least a year from the date of approval of the financial statements ("the going concern period").

We are required to report to you if we have concluded that the use of the going concern basis of accounting is inappropriate or there is an undisclosed material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt over the use of that basis for a period of at least a year from the date of approval of the financial statements. 1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

DATASYS INTEGRATION LIMITED is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework":

Taxation

Current taxes are based on the results shown in the financial statements and are calculated according to local tax rules, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

Going concern

The company has net assets at the year end. It is the parent company of Tracsis Retail and Operations Limied which has sufficient cash resources together with a wide base of customers and limited reliance on external suppliers. As a consequence, the directors believe that the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully despite the current uncertain economic outlook. The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual financial statements.

3. EMPLOYEES AND DIRECTORS

There were no staff costs for the year ended 31 July 2019 nor for the year ended 31 July 2018.

4. **DIRECTORS' EMOLUMENTS**

No directors received any payments in respect of services as a director of the company (2018: nil). It is not possible to separately identify directors' emoluments for this company and accordingly no details are provided. The total emoluments of directors' are disclosed in the financial statements of Tracsis plc in respect of J McArthur, C Barnes and M Cawthra, and Tracsis Traffic Data Limited in respect of A Johnson.
