The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 July 2020.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of a holding company of Tracsis Retail & Operations Limited (previously Datasys Limited), a company providing software for the rail industry. The company did not trade in the current or preceding period.

DIVIDENDS

An interim dividend of £3,218.88 per share was paid on 11 December 2019 (2019: interim dividend £3,218.88 per share). The directors recommend that no final dividend be paid.

The total distribution of dividends for the year ended 31 July 2020 will be £750,000 (2019: £750,000).

Report of the Independent Auditors to the Members of Datasys Integration Limited

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Datasys Integration Limited (the 'company') for the year ended 31 July 2020, which comprise the Statement of Comprehensive income, the Balance Sheet, the Statement of Changes in Equity and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

In our opinion, the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 July 2020 and of its profit for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the 'Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements' section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the UK, including the FRC's Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

The impact of macro-economic uncertainties on our audit

However, no audit should be expected to predict the unknowable factors or all possible future implications for a company associated with these particular events.

Conclusions relating to going concern

DATASYS INTEGRATION LIMITED is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES**Basis of preparation**

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 "Reduced Disclosure Framework" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The Company is exempt by virtue of s400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group. The consolidated financial statements of Tracsis Plc, within which this company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 12.

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. The company has Net Assets and is a holding company with limited activities and no committed costs. The Directors consider that the Company has sufficient funds to continue to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements.
