THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

The directors present their report together with the financial statements for the period ended 31 December 2010

Principal activities and business review

The group's principal activity during the year was that of a manufacturer of prams and related nursery products

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of a holding company

The company was incorporated on 23 December 2009 as Napco 3 Limited and changed its name to Silver Cross Nurseries Limited on 19 February 2010. The company was incorporated with an issued share capital of 550 'A' Ordinary shares and 450 'B' Ordinary shares of £1 each.

On 29 December 2009, the company acquired all of the share capital of Silver Cross (IP) Limited (formerly Silver Cross Nursery Limited) in exchange for all of its issued share capital. The company has been acting as the holding company for the group since this date

On 3 April 2010, 79 'A' Ordinary shares and 64 'B' Ordinary shares of £1 each were repurchased by the company for a total consideration of £1,001,000. These shares were subsequently cancelled on the same day. This represents 14 3% of the total share capital.

The year saw exciting developments for Silver Cross

The Surf Pushchair achieved some tremendous sales volumes and sales of Nursery Toys grew at a very satisfactory rate. Sales of Strollers, Car seats and other wheeled products all increased in what is a very challenging and competitive market.

The group continues to develop new product lines, the most exciting of which is Nursery Furniture, which was on show for the first time at Olympia in October 2010

Following the launch of the Silver Cross website in 2009, sales have attained satisfactory levels in the first full year of trading

The group remains well placed to face the challenges ahead. The balance sheet is robust with Shareholders funds of £3,378k, with no bank debt

The group is subject to foreign exchange risks arising out of movements in the USD/GBP exchange rate. The risk is mitigated by the use of foreign exchange contracts which are used to protect the company from fluctuations in the exchange rate.

Results and dividends

The profit on ordinary activities of the group, after taxation, amounted to £625,877 The directors have not recommended a dividend

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The group and company finance their operations through retained profits Management's objectives are to

- Retain sufficient liquid funds to enable it to meet its day to day obligations as they fall due whilst maximising returns on surplus funds and,
- Minimise the group's and company's exposure to fluctuating exchange rates by entering into forward foreign exchange contracts

THE DIRECTORS' REPORT (continued)

The company's funds are invested in sterling and foreign currency bank accounts. Where appropriate, funds are held primarily in current accounts. The directors believe that this gives them the flexibility to release cash resources at short notice and also allows them to take advantage of changing conditions in the finance market as they arise. All current accounts are with reputable banks.

The group uses forward exchange contracts to hedge its risk exposure on fluctuating foreign currencies

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated profit and loss account and balance sheet include the financial statements of the company and all of its subsidiary undertakings made up to the balance sheet date. The company acquired its interest in Silver Cross (IP) Limited (formerly Silver Cross Nursery Limited) on 29 December 2009 on a share for share exchange basis. Merger accounting principles have been adopted in the preparation of the results to reflect the position as if the group had legally existed for the past two financial periods.

The company is exempt from the requirement to present its own profit and loss account under the provisions of Section 408 of the Companies Act 2006

Intangible fixed assets

Goodwill arising on consolidation, representing the excess of the fair value of consideration paid over the fair value of the net assets acquired, is capitalised and amortised over a maximum economic life of 20 years

Intellectual property is stated at cost and is written off over its' expected useful economic life or over the period of five years, whichever is the shorter. The carrying values of intangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, net of anticipated disposal proceeds, over the estimated useful economic life of that asset as follows

Goodwill Intellectual property - 20 years - 5 years

Turnover

Turnover represents the invoiced amounts of goods sold less returns and allowances, excluding value added tax. Sales are recognised at the point at which the company has fulfilled its contractual obligations and the risks and rewards attaching to the product, such as obsolescence, have been transferred to the customer.

Research and development

Research and development expenditure is written off in the year in which it is incurred

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost is defined as the purchase price of the asset plus other directly attributable costs to bring the asset into the working condition for its intended use

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, net of anticipated disposal proceeds, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Leasehold property - 11% straight line
Plant & Machinery - 33% straight line
Motor Vehicles - 25% straight line
Fixtures & Fittings - 25% straight line
Office Equipment - 33% straight line

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items. Cost represents purchase invoice price together with any incidental costs of purchase.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals payable under operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred by the balance sheet date with certain limited exceptions

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not there will be substantial taxable profits from which future reversals of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Non-monetary assets and liabilities and transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the group after deducting all of its liabilities.
