### DIRECTOR'S REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 25 APRIL 2015

The director presents his report and the financial statements for the period ended 25 April 2015.

### **DIRECTOR'S RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT**

The director is responsible for preparing the director's report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the director to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the director has prepared the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the director must not approve the financial statements unless he is satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the director is required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The director is responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable him to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. He is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### **RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS**

The result for the financial year amounted to £nil (2014: loss £17,000).

The directors do not propose that a dividend be paid (2014: £nil).

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 25 APRIL 2015

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the company's principal accounting policies, which have been consistently applied, is set out below:

### 1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting and financial reporting standards in the United Kingdom.

The current period is for the 52 weeks ended 25 April 2015 ('2015'). The prior period is for the 51 weeks and 6 days ended 26 April 2014 ('2014').

### 1.2 Cash flow

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of SuperGroup Plc and is included in the consolidated financial statements, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS1 (revised 1996).

### 1.3 Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company in respect of services supplied during the period, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

Turnover from the supply of services are recognised by reference to the costs incurred which are then recharged with a suitable mark-up. Revenues are settled in cash.

### 1.4 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date.

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction.

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the profit and loss account.

### 2. TURNOVER

The whole of the turnover is attributable to the contracting of overseas personnel.

All turnover arose within the United Kingdom.
